
To me, that's an outstanding achievement.

What's next in your life?

I'd love to break 80 in golf, but that will probably never happen. And if I could find the time, I really would like to write a book. I'm only 42, so look for it sometime in the next 20 years. But, what's probably next in my life, is more of the same. I love serving the Lord and this church. I love my wife, kids, and family. I'm not overly motivated to divide my primary focus off of those things.

What activities were you involved in at Christian Academy?

I played a lot of basketball, a little baseball, sang in the chorus, and was in the opening scene of *The Miracle Worker* during my senior year. I still remember my opening line, the opening line in the whole play. "Well, she'll live." It is all a blur after that.

In what areas did you feel Christian Academy prepared you for college and your future?

I wasn't the best student in high school. People are impressed when I tell them I finished 23rd in my class, but then I have to admit that there were only 34 of us. When I would take my report card home and show my dad, as he shook his head in disgust, I would always point to my C.E. grade and say, "But look dad, at least I'm making a good grade in what matters most, Christian Education." Honestly, I still have a book in my library from my days at CAL that I still pull off the shelf and use, I Believe Because Of by Batsell Barrett Baxter.

What advice would you give to current students at CAL regarding their school activities and experience?

Going to CAL really is a privilege, but you shouldn't see yourself as privileged. God used my experiences at CAL, among other things, to prepare me for a life of ministry and service. I'm pretty confident God is looking for a lot of students at CAL today to follow a similar path.

What advice would you give parents regarding preparing/supporting students during high school, college and beyond?

CAL parents should be commended because they have laid out a lot of money to ensure their children will receive a

Christian education. It's not cheap. And honestly, a lot of students at CAL may not realize the financial sacrifices their parents make. But parents willingly make the sacrifice, or investment, because they love their kids and want what is best for them. My junior year, I remember telling my parents at lunch one Sunday after church that I wanted to go to Bible college and become a youth minister. They never said, "Hey, we're spending all this money on your education so that you can one day invent widgets!" Instead they affirmed what God was doing in my life.

Parents, if your son or daughter has been drawn closer to Christ because of their experiences at CAL, if they one day tell you over a ham sandwich that they believe God is leading them to enter the ministry or missions, I hope you will affirm them, that you will tell them how you are proud of them, that you love them, and how wonderful it is to see how God is working in their life.

And parents, if your son or daughter tells you when they graduate they want to go to State U and learn to invent widgets, I hope you will affirm them and tell them how you are proud of them and that you love them, and how wonderful it is to see how God is working in their life; because inventing widgets is a mission field too.

What's next in your life?

We are currently serving with the International Mission Board in East Africa as missionaries among a Muslim people group for as long as the Lord calls us. We are hoping to use sports, teaching English, and nursing to witness to these peoples and proclaim the name of Jesus.

Has your Christianity been validated and/or tested since leaving CAL?

Once you go off to college, you are accountable for your own decisions and no one is there to make you go to church. It is a time of testing as your faith really becomes your own. We both grew in our walk with the Lord tremendously while in college. (Kari)

"Since we both went to a Christian, college," said Kari, "my first experience around many nonbelievers was at my work in the hospital. I had many opportunities to witness to coworkers, doctors, and patients. Because my coworkers knew I was a Christian, they would challenge my beliefs but at other times they would come asking for advice and prayer. It was amazing to see lost souls searching for something more. Thankfully, the Lord blessed me with several Christian coworkers whom I confided in and encouraged me."

What can students do to make their faith their own and draw on it for strength?

It definitely comes with time and maturity, but one practical way is to surround yourself with other believers. It is so important to not just attend, but to really get plugged into a local church and Bible study. You should start now to cultivate and develop some of the

spiritual disciplines such as reading the Bible, praying and sharing your faith. God's Word is the foundation for the Christian life and without it we have nothing.

CAL has such a family atmosphere and the support that the school gives to academics and athletics is amazing. We enjoyed spending time in Mrs. Martel's art classes--even though Paul was not very good!

What advice would you give to current students at CAL regarding their school activities and experience?

Get involved in some of the different activities that CAL offers, whether that be student government, sports, academic clubs, etc. It is a great way to meet people from different grades that you may not have gotten to know otherwise. Both of us have great friends who were not in our class that we met through extracurricular activities. Have fun and enjoy life! Time flies!

What advice would you give parents regarding preparing/supporting students during high school, college and beyond?

First of all, it is really important to live out what you say you believe on a daily basis. Your kids do watch how you act and what you say. Do not just send your children to CAL or a Christian college expecting the school to teach and shape them - teaching must come from the home. It is also vital that you encourage them, pray for them, let them know you are proud of them and love them. Allow your children to make some important decisions and even mistakes as they get older. It will


What's going on in your life?

I am so excited about my opportunity to serve at Christian Academy as the Missions Coordinator/Bible Teacher. When I was a student at CAL, I was able to be a part of the birth of the Mission Program by participating the first year. It is such a reminder of God's faithfulness when I come to work every day to watch how His plans for this ministry have been far greater than I might have ever dreamed.

In addition, I am in the process of getting a Masters in Biblical Counseling from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. I hope to use my counseling degree to aid my teaching and mission work. My husband and I desire to always stay involved with discipling youth and mobilizing our teenagers through international mission opportunities.

In what areas did you feel Christian Academy prepared you for college and your future?

Christian Academy offered a firm foundation of a biblical world view upon which God has continued to build. Specifically in my Christian Education major, I was able to refer back to a tangible model of how to daily integrate faith and learning in the classroom. I also remember our senior class retreat. We were supposed to finish up our evening session on Friday night and head out to play games. But thankfully God had different plans! As the speaker finished up, it began to start pouring rain outside! The only way to describe what happened next is

Each student has the privilege of studying at one of the finest Christian schools in the nation, and they are gaining incredible wisdom regarding what we believe and why we believe it! However, this should be a (wonderful) supplement to the interaction you have with your child about their spiritual walk. Ask questions! Pray with them! Read and study the Word together as a family!

"I am the Lord; that is my name! I will not give my glory to another or my praise to idols." Isaiah 42:8 (NIV)

This will offer them the ability to put their knowledge into practice within their home. It is easy for students to compartmentalize their experiences into different areas of life. By maintaining strong spiritual teaching and encouragement from church, to school, to home, we are reminding our students that Christianity is not only a part of their educational experience, but a radical calling to follow the person of Jesus Christ in all of life!

What can students be encouraged to do to make their faith their own and draw on it for strength?

Christianity is all about Christ. And while this seems pretty basic, many times it can be easy to lose sight of Christ in the midst of routine and familiarity. As students seek to make their faith truly personal, it is essential that knowing Christ is the foundation. Read Scripture to discover not only what God has done, but who He is. So, when tough times hit, you can stand firm in the faith. With a solid relationship with Jesus Christ as the basis for all of life, you have someone to turn to in the midst of trials!

A Renewed Spirit

We are offering to students at CAL the phenomenon of spiritual blessing: "growing in the grace and the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ."

When I came to CAL as a Bible teacher, I had expected a temporary tenure in the classroom. Little did I realize that God would be pleased to plant me here for a much longer period of time that I had thought. That brief tenure grew to nine years in the classroom, everyday sharing the teachings of Jesus with more than 1,600 students!

Being in the classroom has been overwhelmingly fulfilling. There have been many more blessings than burdens. (I hope that my classes have been more a source of the former than the latter.) I can reflect upon students of the past who have shared that time of their lives with me and smile. It has been a privilege to have had such an extraordinary experience.

Now, God has blessed me abundantly with a new challenge of the heart: being Campus Minister in the High School.

The challenges are great. The influences of the secular (sometimes profane) culture in which we live tend to distract, coerce, even victimize many of our students through the slick marketing of a lifestyle that doubts, even maligns, the biblical values we hold sacred. Our students are not immune from those influences, but at the same time, have a place like CAL that is seeking to offer the "something more" than the phoniness of a manufactured "societal"

The Campus Ministry Center (working closely with the Missions Program at CAL) hopes to offer students profound activities and events that will challenge them to bring understanding to their faith, deepen their devotion to Christ, and mature them toward being active participants in the Kingdom of God.

Thus far those activities include IMPACT Sessions (formerly "chapel") that will inspire a raised awareness of the person and activity of Jesus Christ in our school; weekly student-led and driven Bible studies that are prepared to enlighten students through the truth of the text; social events that will bring a greater sense of "family" to the campus; and, an annual event of days (called "Spiritual Emphasis Week") that will seek to bring Christ into an even greater focus – lifting up Christ to draw all of us to His sovereignty and insight.

It is the beginning of a faith-driven renewal on our campus that we hope will defend our students from the counter-Kingdom values of our culture, challenge them to rise up in the Presence and Power of our Lord Jesus Christ and participate in His mission to save that which is lost.



How do you impact those around you for Christ?





But I'm reminded of Psalm 119:11, "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you." I still rely on those things that I was taught as a boy and as a teenager at CAL. And today, in spite of my weaknesses and insecurities and struggles, God uses me to minister to others and help them connect with Him.

What can students be encouraged to do to make their faith their own and draw on it for strength?

Things like life and faith are complicated because we make them complicated. When we seek first the kingdom of God in all areas of our life from where we choose to go to college, who we date, who we marry, or how we spend our money, to whatever – life gets uncomplicated. Hard? Maybe. Complicated? No. So I want CAL students to be able to live a God-led and uncomplicated life.

Sounds like a great idea for a book.

Advancing Christian Education Locally and Globally

In this issue of CALIBER, you have had a small glimpse of the impact that our CAL missions department and mission trips have had on our CAL students and the lives of those they have come in contact with. Nearly 100 students participated in one of five school-sponsored mission trips last year. This was only made possible due to your generous contributions totaling over \$80,000 to "our missionaries" when they have requested your help in this area of CAL's ministry.

In addition to giving to CAL mission projects, I am extremely grateful for your continued faithfulness in meeting other financial needs of the Christian Academy ministry. 2008-2009 ANNUAL FUND

Tuition and fees do not cover the entire cost of an education for a CAL student so this is our most important area of giving at the school. CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Capital campaign funding is designed to go "above and beyond" Annual Fund giving to fund major capital projects at Christian Academy.

We have been so blessed during the present capital campaign to have already completed four of our capital projects: new tennis courts, new lighting for the field hockey and soccer fields, rubberizing of the track and a new athletic practice field. We are also happy to announce that site work for the new CAL Athletic Complex is scheduled to begin by this December, weather permitting.



Additional funding is still needed for the completion of the athletic complex and for the following projects: baseball and softball field lights, English Station playground renovation and expansion, additional facility space for the fine arts area and cafeteria expansion.

The Rodman Tabb Endowment Fund is the first CAL endowment fund and was established two years ago. Mr. Tabb, who served in a variety of capacities over 11 years, was a friend to all and a very special person to many alumni.
