SCHOOL OF BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE



he Diplomas of Distinction offered by Christian Academy of Louisville go beyond academic rigor to developing the hearts and minds of our students to be distinctive in a well-developed biblical worldview. The School of Biomedical Science, School of Engineering, School of the Arts and School of Spiritual Formation each offer a cutting-edge curriculum with real life, hands-on experiences to equip students for collegiate and/or professional preparation in these areas of study.


In the arts, students can focus on choral, instrumental and visual arts. Students pursuing a Diploma of Distinction from the School of the Arts are required to take additional core performance or artistic development courses, AP classes and participate in performance/artistic competitions.

In science, students desiring a diploma of distinction from the School of Biomedical Science are required to take AP science courses and four courses that concentrate in science biomedical study. Additionally, students participate in local health initiatives, community and/or international service projects, an internship and acquire CPR certification.


In the School of Spiritual Formation, distinction consists of four semester-long core courses (in addition to regular Bible classes) that focus on developing students as spiritual leaders who bring the kingdom of God to their present and future callings. Additional features in this pathway include individual mentoring, student retreats, guest speakers, an internship, leadership development, field work, an individual student portfolio and opportunities for college credit. There are no weighted grades in this pathway and class sizes are small to enhance a personal discipleship experience.

Courses in the School of Engineering are designed to challenge and expand a student's engineering knowledge, analytical abilities and critical thinking skills in bringing God-driven service to others. SOE-enrolled students will enjoy teamwork, problem-solving activities and learning experiences that will serve students well in life as well as in key professions. Such occupations may include careers in biomedical engineering, civil engineering, mechanical engineering, architectural design, electrical engineering, computer science and many others.



Through Christian Academy's growing and award-winning fine arts programs, students have numerous opportunities to develop their gifts and those opportunities through the Christian Academy School of the Arts. In addition to the Honors, College Prep and Standard Diploma offerings, graduates of the School of the Arts will also receive a diploma with a special School of the Arts designation reflecting their successful completion of the program requirements.



SCHOOL OF SPIRITUAL FORMATION

This organic, three-year pathway fully unites with the mission statement of Christian Academy to develop students with hearts for God who grow as Jesus did in wisdom, stature and in favor with God and men. Some features include individual mentoring, small class size / learning environment, retreats, guest speakers, an internship, college credit, leadership development, Christian service experience and an individual student portfolio. Students who successfully fulfill all of the pathway obligations will receive a Christian Academy diploma of distinction.



SCHOOL OF BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE

Based on course offerings, student involvement and proficiency as well as the integration of science within the school, Christian Academy was designated as a "Distinguished High School" by Project Lead the Way (the nation's premier provider of STEM curriculum) in 2019. Students wishing to take a concentration of science courses in the SBS will earn a diploma distinction reflecting their enrollment in the SBS. In addition to specific coursework, this concentration requires an annual paper and portfolio including insights and reflections on their year, CPR Certification, participation in the Global Missions Health Conference, health service requirements and HOSA membership.



SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING

Courses in the School of Engineering are designed to challenge and expand a student's engineering knowledge, analytical abilities and critical thinking skills in bringing God-driven service to others. 

CELEBRATING TENISHA AND JASON

A Legacy of Excellence in Christian Academy of Indiana Theater

After 14 years of dedication, creativity and faith-driven leadership, Jason and Tenisha Branim are retiring as the drama directors of Christian Academy of Indiana's theater department. Their impact on the program and its students will be felt for years to come.

THE JOURNEY BEGINS

Jason's entry into theater was unexpected. While teaching at another school a friend asked for help with an intermission performance. That small role led to assisting in directing a show the next year. When his colleague moved on, Jason and Tenisha took over directing together, beginning a journey that would shape their careers and inspire countless students.

Tenisha's background in music gave them a foundation but large-scale productions were a new challenge. Nevertheless, they embraced the opportunity to grow a theater program, bringing their strengths together to build something extraordinary.



OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

Every production has its share of challenges. Jason recalls the pressure of executing a 45-second set change in *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*, made more stressful by a problematic candy boat that required last-minute repairs. *Miracle Worker* presented a different challenge as its emotionally intense storyline required deep commitment from the cast.

Their first live orchestra experience during Wizard of Oz was another hurdle. The show contained some of the most difficult instrumental pieces, making opening night a trial by fire. Prince of Egypt also brought obstacles—from inclement weather to facility issues—that required constant adaptability.

TRANSFORMING THE THEATER DEPARTMENT

When the Branims began leading, musicals were a new challenge. Over the years they reinvested profits from performances to enhance the program. Their vision led to improvements in lighting, sound, staging, costumes and overall production quality, transforming the department into a thriving program.

MORE THAN DIRECTORS

For Jason, directing was about investing in students. He pushed his cast and crew beyond their perceived limits, helping them grow in both talent and character. He prioritized meaningful conversations and spiritual growth, ensuring that students knew they were valued beyond their roles on stage.



A LASTING LEGACY

As they step away, Tenisha and Jason leave behind more than a well-equipped theater department. They leave behind a legacy of hard work, faith and excellence. Their hope is that students remember how they were encouraged to push beyond their comfort zones, believe in themselves and use their talents to glorify God.

A MOTTO TO LIVE BY

If the Branims could sum up their philosophy in one phrase it would be: "Glorify God with excellence and hard work." This principle has shaped every production, rehearsal, and interaction, ensuring that Christian Academy's theater program remains a place where students can grow artistically, personally and spiritually.






