As 2025 Comes to an End...

Dear Grandparents,

This season, we'd like to share a "Heart Story" from one of our Christian Academy students, Eli Graves.

Junior Eli Graves loves soccer, Alabama football and hopes to study mechanical engineering one day. For now, at Christian Academy of Indiana, what's most impacted who Eli is and who he envisions himself to be in the future has been two summer mission trips to Honduras.

Leaving the U.S. for the first time "exposed me to true poverty," Eli shared. "The people there have so little but their faith is incredible. They rely on God for everything and He always provides."

This year's trip brought challenges, including their chef suffering a heart attack, but God continued to provide meals in unexpected ways. One powerful moment came when the group encountered a man who was drunk and unwashed outside a restaurant. While students were uneasy, their teacher, Mr. Beardsley, spoke with him, shared the Gospel and invited him to church. "At first, I thought that man was worthless," Eli admitted. "But he's a child of God. Seeing Mr. Beardsley treat him that way changed how I see people. I think about it every day."

Now back home, Eli strives to reach beyond his usual circle of friends. "You might be the only Jesus someone sees," he says.

Helping a local man build his home also taught Eli about leadership. The man didn't micromanage but trusted others to work together. Reflecting on these experiences, Eli says the trips shaped the kind of father and leader he hopes to become. "I want to be like that one day."

We praise God for how He continues to move in the hearts of our students. Stories like Eli's remind us that your generosity fuels Kingdom transformation. As you consider your holiday giving, we invite you to prayerfully support our mission with a meaningful gift that will make an immediate impact.

Welcome to the Team... Thomas Qwinn, Development Director


Hello CAI Grandparents,


