

Thank you grandparents for your support of your grandchildren's enrollment at Christian Academy! I know at times you help them with their classwork, run them back and forth to school, attend their activities and most importantly pray for them. We are grateful for you!

My name is Lorrie Baechtel and I am honored to be in my 11th year as Director of Admissions for Christian Academy School System. Myself and my team, Darlene Kutzner and Christina Johnson, walk alongside our prospective families through the admissions process, Junior Academy through 12th grade. From the first point of contact with a prospective family, we excitedly share our school's desire to walk alongside them and their churches to help develop their child's heart for God and help them grow in wisdom, stature and favor with God and men (Luke 2:52). We also share that our distinctiveness is not only our mission, but also our commitment to strong, biblical worldview instruction, implemented from Junior Academy through 12th grade. As a covenant Christian school, we ask all our families to partner with us by being regular attenders, 3-4 times a month, in their Bible believing churches. As an admissions criteria and part of our admissions file, we gather information for each student about a current church reference. This is a critical part of our ongoing partnership with parents.

As an Admissions team in Kentucky, we have added more than 275 new students for the 2025-2026 school year thus far, with a few more coming! A few highlights from this school year for our team has been the return of our partnership with Global Vision Christian School in Korea. This year we welcomed 7 Korean students from GVCS to our Christian Academy family. They are attending for 7th grade only and are staying with some of our current families. Our homestay families are enjoying getting to know the students and learning more about Korea. We also have welcomed new families in the area for seminary including some from Canada and China. But our greatest joy comes when we hear how our new students are growing in their love for Christ and then going home to share what they are learning with their parents and hopefully grandparents! It truly is our deepest hope that our students will know they are loved by Christ, come to know Him as their Savior and then go out and tell others about Him.




High School Happenings... First Day of School!


