September 5th is our first REMOTE Learning Day



MAP testing has started and will continue through Friday, September 1, 2023. You will receive an email by mid September from Mrs. Patrick with your child's scores. Scores are used for instructional purposes and scheduling.

For the remainder of the month, both counselors will spend time introducing themselves and getting to know the students.

September is National Suicide Prevention Month

Both counselors will meet with students in their **Bible** classes to discuss **Mental Health and Wellness**. Students will be given resources and tools on how to deal with stress, anxiety, and sadness. The most important takeaway from these conversations is to always talk to a trusted adult.
