
## Giving to others

### Counselor's Corner

It's hard to believe we are almost half way through the school year! Mrs. Agee has been in every student's classroom on multiple occasions, working on suicide prevention and identifying healthy coping skills. In the new year, she will continue working with students on practicing healthy coping skills and self-advocacy in school and at home. Having the ability to advocate for yourself is such an important skill to develop, and one you will use the rest of your life. It is important for our students to know that their grades do not define them, and to learn and develop the ability to successfully struggle through daily challenges. We often let our struggles define us. Our identity is in Christ, and we are each a child of God. Middle school is the time our students need to learn invaluable coping skills that enable them to be successful in high school and beyond. If you or your family are in distress, please feel free to reach out for support.

Additionally, with the semester coming to an end, letters are going out to let parents know if your student is considered to be on Academic Probation or "At Risk Status" based on Quarter 1 grades, and current status of Quarter 2 grades. It isn't too late to bring up Quarter 2 grades. Canvas is a great tool for you, as parents, to utilize to ensure you have an up-to-date picture of your child's success in school. If your child earned D's and/or

F's quarter one, they are at risk to be on academic probation by the end of first semester. As is stated in the Family Handbook, students are considered academically at-risk w

If the overall GPA is below 1.50, students are placed on academic probation. This GPA is based on a 4.0 grading scale.
