Feel free to take what you need, and encourage your student to do the same! Some of the resources include strategies for easing anxiety, understanding grief, dealing with anger, eating disorders, teen suicide, healthy boundaries, identifying the need for an attitude adjustment, and just some fun facts about the brain!

Eighth graders recently had an opportunity to visit some of the pathways of distinction programs available in our high school, as they begin to make decisions about where they want to spend the next four years! If you have an 8th grader, be sure to ask them about the specific Schools of Biomedical Sciences, Spiritual Formation, Engineering, Visual and Performing Arts, as well as the Robotics Program. We hope you and your student continue to find a home at CAL as you transition to high school next fall!

With the conclusion of the first quarter, now is the time to discuss with your student his or her academic progress. Grades have been posted, so you and your student can identify accomplishments and challenges, as well as set goals for second quarter and the end of semester one. Canvas is a great tool for you, as parents, to utilize to ensure you have an up-to-date picture of your child's success in school. If your child earned D's and/or F's quarter one, they are at risk to be on academic probation by the end of first semester. As is stated in the Family Handbook, students are considered academically at-risk when their GPA is between 1.51-1.99. If the overall GPA is below 1.50, students are placed on academic probation.
