Varsity, JV boys lacrosse has perfect week

The varsity and JV boys lacrosse teams continued a strong start to the season with a sweep of both Ballard and Collins last week.

The varsity hosted Ballard on Tuesday 3/18 and prevailed with a hard fought 8-7 victory over the Bruins.

The first quarter ended tied at 3-3 with goals by Nolan Seifert, Ryland Adams and Jax Anderson.

CAL led 5-3 going

into halftime behind two goals scored by Gaines Howard. The Bruins responded with a strong start to the third quarter with three quick goals. CAL evened up the score with a goal by Logan Miller, but Ballard scored again to lead 7-6 going into the fourth quarter.

A goal by Gaines Howard at the seven minute mark knotted the score at 7-all, then Howard scored again with just 3 minutes to go to give CAL the WIN with a final score of 8-7.

The JV team rolled past Ballard by a final score of 10-2.

CAL outscored the Bruins 5-0 in the first half of play with 2 goals by Alex Wieringa. Ryan Brown, Will Ernst, Will Seifert contributed a goal each.

The second half started with Wieringa and Eli Snyder scoring a goal apiece, but Ballard countered with 2 of their own. However, Will Seifert scored two more and Wieringa scored the final goal of the game, making the final score 10-2.

HS girls lacrosse hosts 7th annual Ice Breaker Inv.

The HS girls lacrosse team hosted the seventh annual Icebreaker Invitational High School Lacrosse Tournament, which included 21 teams and 32 games, this past weekend.

CAL defeated Collins 8-6 in their first contest on Friday, never trailing the game.

Goals were scored by senior Saibrin De Lessio (3), freshman Maddie VanAllsburg (3), junior Rachel Wedding, and freshman Ella Hodge. Saibrin De Lessio, Rachel Wedding, Maddie VanAllsburg, and sophomore Channing Hill each had one assist.

Freshman goalie Lucy Moody had four saves on he night.

Saturday, the Centurions faced Oldham County. The Lady Centurions got behind early in the game but fought their way back in the second half tying the game. 4-4.

Unfortunately, Oldham Co. got a late goal off a free position shot, taking the lead 5-4.

With less than 20 seconds remaining in the game Maddie VanAllsburg got into the 8-meter with a crease roll, but OC's defense collapsed with a double team, challenging the shot allowing OC's goalie to make the game-clinching save.

Goals were scored by Rachel Wedding (2), Ella

Hodge, and sophomore Chatty Thompson in the defeat. Maddie VanAllsburg had two assists and Lucy Moody had two saves.

Following their win against CAL, Oldham Co. advanced to the Championship game against Assumption and won 8-7 in overtime.

CAL took on South Oldham in the last game of the weekend. The Centurions scored first, but South Oldham answered back and then took the lead. The game continued with both teams scoring back-to-back goals.

However, South Oldham took a two goal lead and the Lady Centurions lost 5-3. Goals were scored by Saibrin De Lessio, Rachel Wedding, and senior Olivia Hall. Maddie VanAllsburg had two assists and Lucy Moody had two saves.

CAL's junior varsity team went 3-0 during the tournament and came out as JV pool champions.

Varsity baseball opens season 2-1, JV wins opener

The varsity baseball team opened the 2025 season with a 2-1 slate last week.

The first win was a comefrom-behind effort to top Southern 10-4 on Monday after trailing as many as four runs during the game.

The Centurions broke through with seven runs in the fifth inning on the way to victory.

Trevor Daugherty, Kaden Crawford, Cameron Combs and Carson Hahn, and Lucas Hale all had RBIs.

Eli Depugh earned the win for the Centurions. The righty gave up three hits and zero runs over 3 1/3 innings, striking out two and walking three. David Haire began the game, surrendering three hits and four runs over 2 2/3 innings, striking out one and walking two. Alex Daugherty appeared in relief to close out the game with a scoreless seventh inning.

The Centurions had a strong night offensively.
Leadoff hitter Crawford led the Centurions with three hits in three at bats. Hale led the Centurions with three runs batted in. The left

fielder went 2-for-3 on the day. Jackson Burke, Trevor Daugherty, and Hahn all collected multiple hits for the Centurions.

On Tuesday night, the Varsity Centurions played John Hardin in the 2A Section 3 play-in game in E-Town.

The Centurions were hot from the beginning of the game with one run in the first inning and five runs in the second.

The scoring continued from there, and CAL won 16-1.

The highlight of the evening was a homerun by Hudson Overstreet in the second inning.

Trevor Daugherty earned the win for the Centurions. The lefty allowed one hit and one run over three innings, striking out four and walking one. Alex Daugherty threw two innings of zero-run ball in relief for CAL. The hurler surrendered one hit, striking out three and walking two.

Combs led CAL with three runs batted in. The Centurions ran wild on the

base paths, collecting 14 stolen bases for the game.

The varsity Centurions ended the week on Friday night with a 5-1 loss to North Oldham in the 2A sectional semifinals.
Cameron Combs took the loss for the Centurions. The pitcher went four innings, giving up four runs (one earned) on three hits, striking out one and walking one.

Ruffin and Crawford each collected one hit for the Centurions. Overstreet led CAL with one run batted in.

Next up for Christian Academy-Louisville Varsity Centurions is a game at LKY on Monday.

The JV baseball team opened its season by defeating Southern 15-1 last Monday thanks in part to nine runs in the first inning.

Levi White singled home two runs, an error scored one run, Nathan Durston hit a sacrifice fly, Braeden Meade singled in three runs, Eli Depugh drew a bases loaded walk, and one run scored on a balk.

The Centurions scoring continued in the top of the

second inning with six runs on a hit and multiple walks. Tyler Helmerich, White and Depugh all walked with the bases loaded, Greyson Cline singled in another run and two runs scored on another play.

Garrett Augustine stepped on the hill first for the JV Centurions and surrendered zero hits and zero runs over one inning. Helmerich appeared in relief for CAL.

Depugh and White were a solid one-two punch in the lineup, as each drove in three runs for the JV Centurions. Meade, Cline, and White each collected one hit. The JV Centurions had a strong eye at the plate, piling up 11 walks for the game. Depugh and White led the team with two free passes each.

The JV Centurions, unfortunately, had their other games canceled this week due to the weather.

The Christian Academy-Louisville Junior Varsity Centurions will travel to Eastern for their next game on Monday.

goals by Mason Thomas and one each by Seifert, Adams and Anderson to secure an 11-3 victory for CAL!


The JV squad stayed hot with a lopsided 16-0 win over Collins in the night cap.
