## Varsity baseball drops two of three

The varsity baseball team went 1-2 on the road last week.

The Centurions opened the week with a 14-4 win against the Louisville Home School Kentucky (LKY) Saints Monday night.

Cameron Combs led the team with three hits at five at bats, including a 2-run homerun. CAL led wire to wire after scoring four runs in the top of the first.

David Haire earned the win for CAL, surrendering seven hits and four runs over four innings, striking out two and walking none. Alex Daugherty tossed three innings of one-run ball in relief to close out the game. The hurler gave up two hits, striking out one and walking two.

CAL had a good night on the basepaths, accumulating seven stolen bases for the game.

On Tuesday night, CAL fell 4-2 at Kentucky Country Day despite out-hitting the Bearcats six to four.

Trey Tipton led CAL with two hits while also taking the pitching loss for CAL. The righty went five innings, allowing three runs on four hits, striking out six and walking five.

Overstreet and Crawford each drove in one run for CAL.

The Centurions also turned two double plays in the game, but it wasn't

enough to secure the win.


Thursday night was a pitcher's duel with St. Xavier. However, St. X was just a little bit stronger at the plate in their 3-1 victory.
