



## Varsity baseball goes 3-2 on spring break trip

Varsity baseball enjoyed its spring break at Jackie Robinson's Training Complex in Vero Beach, Fla., this past week.

After a 2-2 start to the week, the Centurions final game in Florida saw them paired with the 25th-ranked Scott County Cardinals.

Cobe Ross launched a homerun over the left field wall in the second inning to give CAL an early 1-0 lead. The Cardinals responded with two runs in the bottom of the inning to take the lead. The Centurions tied the score in the fourth inning when Jackson Watkins drew a bases loaded walk.

Heading into the 7th inning, the Centurions trailed 4-2 and were down to their final out when Kaden Crawford singled on a line drive to center field to keep the game alive.

Then senior Bradey Moad hit a 2-run game tying HR over the left field wall to tie the score at 4-4 in his first game of the spring.

Eli Deming singled on a line drive to center field and eventually raced home from first base to score on a double by Ross to center field, pushing the Centurions ahead 5-4.

CAL shut down the Cardinals offense in the bottom of the inning, aided by Moad throwing out a runner attempting to steal second.

David Haire started on the mound for the Centurions and threw 4.1 innings, giving up three hits and three earned runs while striking out one. Ross came in and pitched the final 2.2 innings, getting the win while giving up three

Mackenzie King tossed a no-hitter in the abbreviated win, striking out five along the way.

CAL dropped a close contest by a final score of 9-8 to Heritage (Palm

Bay) the next day, then rounded out the trip with a 15-4 loss to Space Coast.

The Centurions will return to action on April 15 against Butler.

Middle distance scorers included Kelsea Burkhead (400) and Kylie Burkhead

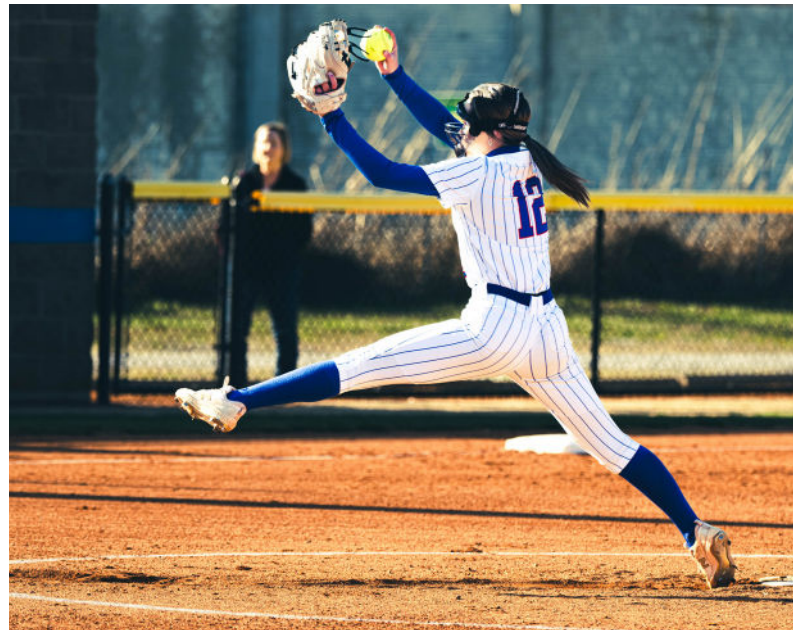
(400, 800).

hits and zero earned runs while striking out one Cardinal.

CAL Varsity opened the trip against the Greenup County Musketeers a few days earlier.

CAL trailed 3-0 heading to the bottom of the first, but the Centurion offense pushed two runs across with a balk and a Cameron Combs sacrifice fly to tighten the score at 3-2.

The Centurions stayed hot offensively in the second inning. Singles by Ross, Deming, and Mason Wilt loaded the bases for the Centurions. Then back-to-back bases load walks gave CAL a 4-3 lead. Combs singled to left field on a line drive to push the Centurion lead to 5-3. With the bases still loaded, Nathan King launched a double to left field to clear the bases. King scored on a fielding error to extend CAL's lead to 9-3.

In the fourth inning, Logan York scored a Tipton single to center field to increase CAL's lead to 10-3.

The offensive outburst was enough to lead CAL to a 10-6 victory over the Musketeers.

Vince Possidento started on the mound and earned the win for the Centurions, pitching 4.2 innings and giving up 7 hits and 5 earned runs. York came out of the bullpen and shut down the Musketeers for the final 2.1 innings. He allowed one hit and no earned runs while

striking out two.

The next day, CAL took on No. 2 Boyd County.

After getting down 2-0, the Centurions manufactured a run with a sacrifice fly by Ross to draw the Centurions within a run.

In the top of the fourth, CAL tied the score at 2-2, as Crawford singled to left field, stole second base, advanced to third on an overthrow by the catcher and scored on a wild pitch.

Now trailing 8-2 heading into the bottom of the seventh, the Centurions didn't go down without a fight. Three hits and three free passes helped CAL get back within a pair of runs at 8-6, but the Centurions' comeback fell just short.

CAL bounced back against Dayton Christian the next day.

CAL jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first inning on a two-run double by King.

CAL added two more runs in the second and third innings to take a 6-2 advantage.

In the bottom of the sixth inning, the Centurions put the game out of reach.

A Drew Thurman double, two walks and an error helped the Centurions push the lead to 10-2 and set the table for Wilt to deliver the final shot to the Warriors on a two-run single to give Centurion 12-2 victory. Drew Harned took the start on the mound and earned a complete game victory for

the Centurions. He threw six innings, giving up five hits and two earned runs to go along with four strikeouts and no walks.

With CAL's senior trip looming, the Centurions' next varsity game is April 13 against Lexington Catholic at home.

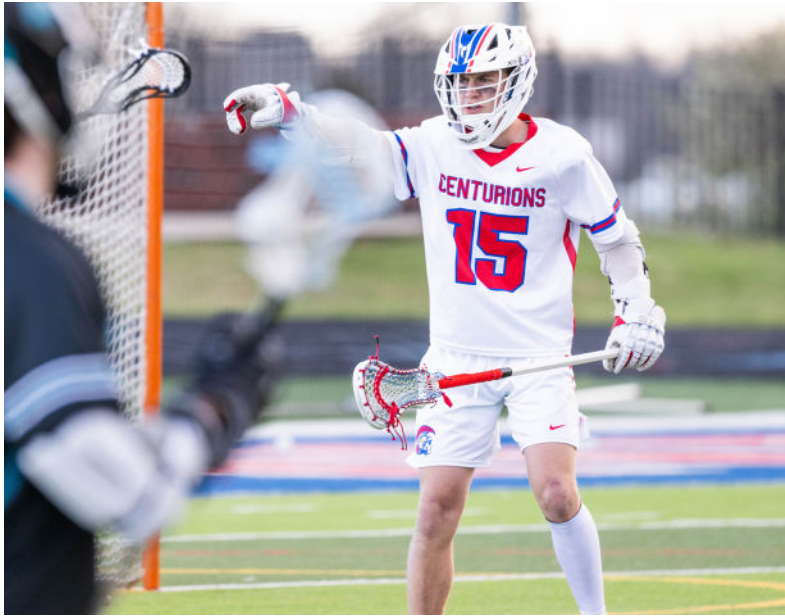
