The Centurion girls soccer squad implemented both strategies in their first week of the 2023 season and were rewarded with an undefeated record.

On Monday the offense unleashed a shower of goals against the Pleasure Ridge Park Panthers.

Just after the opening whistle, Taylor Touche took a pass from Ella Mast, outran a Panther defender, and punched it past the keeper to take the lead 20 seconds into the match.

Less than a minute later senior Elise Michel dribbled through a claw of Panthers and launched a

The 16-player roster consists of 12 underclassmen, but the four seniors have served as the program's backbone and provided excellent leadership.

CAL's senior class is made up of Brady Smith, Trey Berger, Kyle Gladieux, and Seth Godbey. Smith is the defending KHSAA state champion and has played well to start the season. He has won three events and placed second in the other two. Winning at Battle of the Bridge, Brady won in a one-hole playoff (-2). He also won in a playoff in the 53rd KIT (-3). His lowest round was at Oxmoor Country Club, where he tied a course record at 64 (-8).

Trey Berger and Kyle Gladieux are off to their best seasons with the program. Berger had a top-ten finish going 4-under on the last five holes at Danville, and Gladieux has helped the team finish well with several scores in the 70s.

Sophomores Will Judd and Jacob Elliott have also had an opportunity to contribute. Judd, who was part of the 2021 state championship team as an 8th grader, continues to grow and mature. He placed seventh at the Charger Invitational and the Trinity Invitational. Jacob Elliott has been part of the top five players over the last two years and competes in every tournament.

Newcomer Freshman Zach Gladieux has been excellent through the first part of the season with a top finish of 7th at the Charger Invitational.

The big upstart to the team has been 7th grader Brady Faulkner. Brady had a low round of 71 (-1) in the Bullitt East Invitational at Tanglewood. Brady has consistently played all season with all rounds in the 70s.

CAL will compete this weekend in the Dragon Invitational at Nevel Meade Country Club.

Varsity boys soccer began its season with a handful of competitive contests.

Touche notched a hat trick within the first 12 minutes of the game. Rory Ross struck next only to be followed by a goal from Zoey Morgan widening the lead to 7-0.

The skies opened up with a sprinkle but quickly grew to a downpour. The CAL faithful retreated to their vehicles, but the Centurions kept pressing.

Hayley Springer scored a pair of goals, as did Ashlyn Toby. Zoey Morgan scored a second, and defender Annslee Philpot came forward to join in the scoring bringing the total to 13-0 at the halftime whistle, which also served as the end of the match.

Assists on the day came from Zoey Morgan (3), Taylor Touche (1), Ella Mast (1), and Rebecca Raisor (1).

Tuesday brought a trip to the sprawling campus of Martha Layne Collins High School named after Kentucky's only female governor.

This time the Centurions relied on an impressive defensive effort led by Addison Chandler, Luna Guarin, Kynlee Cornett, Zoey Morgan, and Anslee Philpot, backed

up by resilient goalkeeper Samantha Durston who finished the day with 7 saves and a shut-out.

Durston's day was nearly cut short after a collision with a Collins striker. Christina Schroering entered the goal while the training staff worked on Durston. After several minutes Durston reentered the game and protected the CAL goal for the remainder of the match with diving saves and leaping catches.

CAL scoring came from juniors Hadley Snowden and Taylor Touche.

Snowden blasted from deep into the far upper corner to give CAL the lead and the winning goal. Less than ten minutes later, Taylor Touche taught an object lesson on never giving up by gathering her own rebound and popping it into the back of the net to beat the Titan keeper.

CAL brought their perfect record back home on Saturday where they faced more weather and a Bullitt East team that just wouldn't quit. Thunder and lightning delayed the start for 90 minutes, and a heavy downpour led to a drenched field and a slow start for the Centurions who seemed to chase the Chargers for the first ten minutes of the match.

As the sun came out, the Centurions began to heat up, testing the Bullitt East defense on close call corner and free kicks.

Nonetheless, the match was scoreless at halftime. The tie was broken four minutes into the second half when Ella Mast took a pass from Elise Michel and beat a Charger defender to slip a shot past the keeper to give CAL a 1-0 lead.

The Chargers responded to even the score on a corner play and an improbably long shot just beyond the reach of leaping Durston.

Several minutes later, Touche charged past two defenders before being tripped in the box setting up a penalty kick, which she neatly placed into the far corner.

CAL led 2-1 with 18 minutes left in the game. The heat and humidity took a toll on both teams, and the Chargers evened the score with 8 minutes remaining.

CAL worked to get several scoring chances but did not convert, and were forced to settle for the tie.

This coming week the Centurions travel to Bardstown for the first round of the 2A Section Tournament on Monday evening. The Centurions will wrap up the week on Saturday morning with an away match at Mercy Academy.






