HS girls soccer splits a pair to open season

High school girls soccer split its first two full games of the 2025 season this past week.

On Monday, CAL rolled past CEC by a score of 6-0 in both teams' first game of the campaign.

CAL had several scoring opportunities in the first half and broke through twice with goals by freshman Alice Dobring and sophomore Blakely Touche to take a 2-0 lead by halftime.

Touche scored twice more in the opening minutes of the second half to complete a hat trick and stretch the advantage to 4-0.

Senior Zoey Morgan and junior Olivia Hill scored in a quick succession of Touche's third goal to bring the Centurion lead to 6-0, where it held for the final 18 minutes of the contest.

On Friday, CAL traveled to Owensboro Catholic and fell 3-1 to the host Aces.

Dobring scored CAL's lone goal in the first half.

The score was knotted at one apiece at the break, but the Aces

scored twice in the second half to pull out the victory.

The next day, CAL looked to bounce back at Apollo.

The Centurions were doing just that, leading 4-0 before the game was called due to heat just under halfway through the first half. The game did not last long enough to be considered an official result.

This week, CAL will look to repeat as 2A Section 3 champions, beginning with a home clash with visiting Spencer County in the tournament play-in game on Monday at 7:30 p.m.

5th/6th football stays perfect vs. Rams

Last Saturday, Christian Academy of Louisville 5th/6th grade football team traveled to Benny Watkins Field in Frankfort, KY, to take on the Franklin County Rams.

The heat was fierce—hotter than Uncle Eustice's world-famous County Fair chili—and it showed on the field during the opening plays.

Team captains Ford Manley, Owen Smith, Hunter Warrell, and Riggs Runyon represented CAL at the coin toss.

The Rams kicked off to start the game, and Owen Smith recovered the ball to set the tone early. By the end of the first quarter, though, there were more false starts between the two teams than Grandma Millie's sourdough starter back in the winter of '34!

In the middle of the battle, Coach Lowe encouraged the boys with a timely reminder: "Even though it's hot, play to your potential!" The second quarter opened with the Rams in possession, but more penalties set them back—holding, false starts, offsides, and eventually a costly turnover that handed the ball back to CAL.

Seizing the momentum, Jack Lowe, Jake Blandford, and Gavin Ihnen worked together to push the offense down the field. Their efforts paid off when CAL broke through with a touchdown, putting the first points on the board with just 1:12 left in the half.

At halftime, the officials announced that the second half would move faster due to the heat, with the game clock running continuously. The sigh of relief from the stands was almost as loud as the cheers!

After a quick water break, Hunter Warrell kicked off to start the half. The defense stepped up strong—Jack Lowe brought down a Rams runner, followed by a big tackle from Caden Walker. On the next play, John Digby wrapped up another Rams player, forcing a tough 2nd-and-8.

Moments later, Jonathan Jackson delivered a stop on the Rams' #0, leading to a turnover on downs. CAL's defense kept the pressure coming—fumbles, tackles for loss, more holding calls, and incomplete passes eventually gave the ball back to the Centurions.

As the quarter wound down, the Rams got the ball back but were cut short by CAL's defense, ending the third with no score change.

Early in the fourth, Caden Walker made another strong tackle, and John Digby finished off a 4thand-5 stand to force another turnover.

That's when the Centurion offense came alive.

Jack Lowe powered forward for a first down at the 40, then picked up another after a false start flag. On a sweep play, he broke loose for yet another first down

before being pushed out of bounds. Finally, Lowe capped the drive with a touchdown run, extending CAL's lead. Owen Smith caught the conversion, bringing the score to 13-0. The Rams weren't done, though. On the kickoff, Simpson broke free for an outstanding return, scoring a touchdown and completing the conversion to make it 13-6 with just 18.5 seconds left.

An offsides penalty on the Rams' final kick sealed the deal—and CAL walked away with a hard-fought 13-6 victory.

It wasn't always pretty, but the Centurions stayed undefeated and proved they can battle through the heat, flags, and tough competition

Next Saturday, CAL heads over to Eastern High School to try to stay hot against the ELS Eagles at 1 p.m.
