



Varsity girls soccer starts season 3-0

CAL girls opened the season against Martha Lane Collins in a game that saw CAL dominate the second half after a tightly contested first half.

Both teams' defenses were strong early on, with CAL freshman goalkeeper Grace Hureau and senior Addison Chandler delivering a solid performance to keep the Titans scoreless at halftime. CAL had a few

opportunities to score but didn't convert.

The breakthrough came in the second half when senior Taylor Touche received a pass from Lydia Wallace and skillfully dribbled past two Titan defenders to score the first goal of the season for CAL.

Soon after, senior Hadley Snowden's corner kick inadvertently resulted in an own goal by a Titan player to put

CAL ahead 2-0.

Thirty-eight minutes into the second half, Hadley Snowden passed the ball through the middle of the field, and Touche ran it down and scored again, this time with a clean finish in a one-on-one situation with the Titan's goalkeeper.

The scoring was capped off with six minutes remaining when Snowden sent a well-placed shot over the

goalkeeper to secure a 4-0 victory for CAL.

Overall, it was a strong performance by CAL, which showcased its attacking prowess in the second half and solidified its defensive efforts throughout the match.

The JV girls soccer team also beat Collins 3-0 in a "pitch perfect" effort on Monday.

3rd/4th football starts season 2-0

The Centurion Pee Wees picked up a 12-7 comeback victory against the Shelby Storm on Aug. 17.

The Storm started off with a bang, taking their first play of the game down to the goal line. They were able to punch it in on the next play to grab an early 7-0 lead. Thankfully, the CAL defense tightened up holding the Storm scoreless for the remainder of the game.

The first offensive possession for CAL resulted in a fumble recovered by the Storm. Prior to the turnover, the drive saw Preston Burge pick up a first down and Miles Johnston complete a 7-yard pass to Benjamin Davis. Davis also made a heads-up tackle on the fumble recovery to prevent any return.

The Storm returned the favor on their next possession with a fumble of their own, forced and recovered by Gavin Ihnen.

The back and forth first half ended with CAL holding a threatening Storm offense at the end of the half to get to the intermission still down 7-0.

Benjamin Davis and Beckham Albright chipped in tackles during the first half. Preston Burge was disruptive from the linebacker position, getting into the back field and putting pressure on the Storm QB. Graham Kippes had a tackle for loss that forced a critical turnover on downs at the

end of the half. Aidan Cox had great pursuit downfield from his lineman position getting in on the tackle action.

The second half belonged to the Centurions.

CAL took the ball to begin the half, and Ihnen reeled off a 40-yard carry to the goal line. Preston Burge was able to punch the ball into the end zone on the next play. The conversion failed, leaving CAL trailing 7-6.

The ensuing kickoff saw Benjamin Davis with another heads-up play, recovering the onside kick to give CAL another possession. Unfortunately, CAL quickly gave the ball back to the Storm with a fumble.

In a wild series of events, the Storm had a fumble of their own on their next possession, which was recovered by Beckham Albright. The next CAL offensive possession came up short, ending with a turnover on downs.

The CAL defense continued its dominance on the next series with Eli Hilpp getting in on the action with a tackle at the line of scrimmage. Preston Burge forced pressure up the middle, causing another Storm fumble that was recovered by Johnny Newsome.

The Centurions got the ball back and were on the move to take the lead. The offensive line held strong and Ihnen and Burge

both had long runs. Ihnen punched in a two-yard touchdown run giving CAL their first lead of the day. The attempted two-point conversion failed, and CAL clung to a 12-7 lead with time winding down in the fourth quarter.

The CAL defense needed one more stop to put the game away. Eli Hilpp again had a tackle at the line of scrimmage, Ryder Green got in the action from the nose guard position with a tackle, and Beckham Albright wasn't fooled by the reverse play and notched a tackle for loss. The Storm turned it over on downs, and CAL was able to get the ball back and ice the game with one more gutsy first down run from Ihnen.

The Pee Wees move to 2-0 on the season with the win and will take on the Lyndon Lightning next week.

The previous weekend, the Pee Wee team kicked off its season with a 25-7 victory against the Franklin County Rams.

Many friends and family of the team made the journey out to Frankfort to create a raucous crowd to cheer on the CAL boys.

Franklin County started the game by recovering an onside kick on the opening kickoff. The CAL defense proved true on the first drive, recording a three and out that included a tackle for loss by Johnny Newsome.

Franklin County punted the ball, which was fair caught by Beckham Albright. The first CAL offensive possession started on their own 25-yard line and saw a healthy dose of the thunder and lightning running back combo of Preston Burge and Gavin Ihnen. Burge was able to make a fourth down conversion picking up 12 yards on 4th and 5. Ihnen broke loose on the next set of downs, running 45 yards for a touchdown to give CAL an early 6-0 lead.

The CAL defense took the field again and struggled to stop the Rams offense. Graham Kippes made multiple tackles from the linebacker position to save larger gains, and Ihnen made a fantastic open field tackle towards the sideline. However, the Rams were able to find the end zone and converted the extra point to take a 7-6 lead.

With five minutes remaining in the second quarter, the CAL offense took the field and scored quickly. Burge set up the touchdown with a 25-yard run to the 1-yard line. Ihnen punched it in two plays later.

With three minutes left in the half, the CAL defense took the field again with a 12-7 lead. The CAL defense held strong and was able to hold a threatening Rams offense out of the end zone before the end of the first half. The drive saw tackles by Benjamin Davis, Miles John-



ston, Eli Hilpp, Quinn Brakmeier, and a fourth down stop by Beckham Albright that forced the turnover on downs.

The opening drive of the second half saw the CAL defense stand strong again, forcing another turnover on downs. The defensive line was disruptive on this drive with tackles at the line of scrimmage by Aidan Cox and Lincoln Barker. Quinn Brakmeier had an amazing open field tackle on fourth down to force the turnover on downs.

There was more of the same from the CAL offense on the next drive, as Burge and Ihnen led the way for another CAL score to give the CAL Pee Wee's a little breathing

room at 19-7. Ihnen picked up his third touchdown on the day on a 25-yard run. The CAL defense forced another turnover on downs on the next Rams possession with Avery Denton and Josh Robinson chipping in tackles.

Ihnen had another 65-yard run on the next possession, taking the ball down to the 25-yard line. All of Burge's hard work for the day was rewarded with a 25-yard touchdown run on the drive. This extended the CAL lead to 25-7 right as the final seconds on the game clock were ticking off.

1st/2nd football wins defensive battle

The CAL Mighty Mites took the field on 8/17 to take on the Shelby Storm.

CAL won the toss and deferred to give the Storm the ball. The decision proved to be a good one as the CAL defense was solid on their first possession forcing a turnover on downs on a failed fourth down conversion.

CAL's second offensive possession of the day resulted in a 35-yard touchdown run from Christian Sheehan putting CAL ahead 6-0.

The CAL defense was stout for the remainder of the first half, keeping a

threatening Storm team out of the end zone after they drove to the 10-yard line at the end of the first half.

Many Mighty Mites contributed to the defensive shutout, including Matthew McKinney and Colt Bindner getting into the backfield for a tackle for loss. Madden Johnston, Christian Sheehan, Mitchell Flynn, Cooper Happel, and Ryan Clark added tackles in the half. Chapman Amlung recovered a fumble on the Storm third series.

The CAL Mighty Mites took a 6-0 lead into halftime. The second half was a

continuance of the defensive battle between the two teams.

The game came down to a final drive by the Storm with 3 minutes left in game to tie or take the lead.

The Storm drove inside the 10-yard line with one minute remaining in the game and a full set of downs to work with. On a third-and-goal play, the Storm attempted a reverse, but the Mighty Mites were not fooled with Ryan Clark staying at home to make a solo open field tackle near the sideline.

With one play left the

Storm reverted to more trickery with a reverse play. Again, the Mighty Mite defense stayed at home and Christian Sheehan was able to make the tackle to win the game 6-0.

Many other Centurian boys added tackles on the drive including Cooper Happel, Miles Happel, and Mitchell Flynn.

The CAL Mighty Mites advance to 2-0 with a showdown against the Lyndon Lightning upcoming next week.

The CAL soccer team continued their impressive start to the season on Saturday with a commanding 6-0 victory over Ludlow High School.

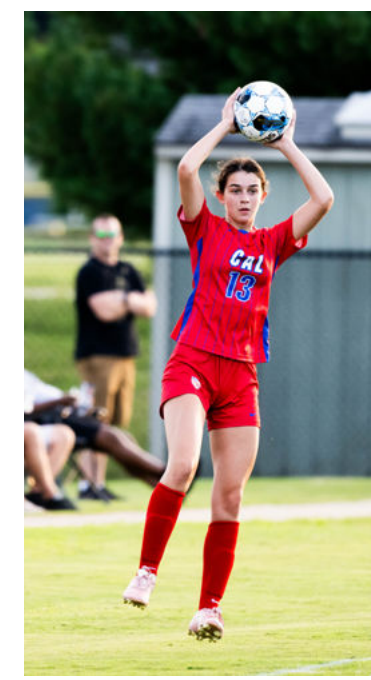
