Boys golf finishes one stroke short of tournament win

Christian Academy golf came up short in its competition this weekend at the South Oldham Dragon Invitational, which featured the top teams from the Sixth Region and other leaders from across the state.

The Centurions finished one shot behind the tournament champions, Madison Central and Louisville Trinity. The two teams are currently ranked second and third in the state rankings, which are determined by a point system tied to tournament placements. CAL is ranked 9th in the most recent update.

Sophomore Will Judd shot a 69 (-3) to lead the team with a fifth place finish in the event at Nevel Meade Golf Course. Senior Kyle Gladieux had a tremendous effort, shooting 73 (+1). Seventh grader Brady Faulkner 74 (+2). Sophomore Jacob Elliott finished with a 76. Senior Brady Smith shot a 77.

CAL entered a second

team to compete, and it finished eighth overall.

Freshman Zach Gladiuex led the second team with an impressive 75, followed by Trey Berger with a 76 and seventh grader Luke Elliott with a 78.

CAL began weekday ninehole matches this past week as well. On Monday, CAL beat Trinity at Crescent Hill Golf Course 156-161. CAL was led by seventh grader Luke Elliott with a 35 (-1) and freshman Grant Pellowe with a 39 (+3).

On Tuesday, CAL defeated South Oldham 156-175. CAL was led by Zach Gladieux's 37 (+1) and Brady Faulkner's 38 (+2).

On Thursday CAL lost to St. X in a match at Oxmoor CC. Sam Bates fired the Centurion's low-round with a 41 (+5).

CAL has head-to-head nine-hole matches on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday this week, as well as a tournament this Saturday.

3rd/4th football wins in blowout fashion

The 1-0 CAL Centurion Pee Wees took on the Louisville Patriots at Christian Academy on Saturday.

The Centurion defense started the game with a pair of sacks by Jack Lowe and Logan Hornback. The first drive resulted in a punt with CAL taking over on the 37. CAL had a two-play drive with a catch by Zion De Lessio from Jake Blandford for 22 yards and a touchdown run by Jack Lowe. The two-point conversion was good from Blandford to Collin Hammer.

CAL attempted an onside kick, but it was recovered by the Patriots at the 50-yard line. The drive went nowhere following a sack by Blandford, and the Patriots turned the ball over on downs.

Gavin Ihnen took a pitch for 49 yards to the house on the first play of the next series. Then he caught a pass for a two-point conversion to put CAL up 16-0.

CAL attempted another onside kick, which was recovered on the 50-yard line by the Patriots, but CAL forced another turnover on downs near the 40-yard line.

During the next drive, Blandford had two QB keepers rolling out of the pocket, one for a 20-yard scamper and another for a score from two yards out. Jack Lowe capped off the drive with a carry for the extra point to make the score 23-0.

Again, an onside kick off was attempted, but this time, CAL's Eli Hilpp emerged from the pile holding the on-side kick and CAL took

over on the 46 yard line. The Centurions moved the ball quickly and efficiently with a 16 yard pass to De Lessio. Jake Blandford picked up 20 yards on a fourth and 19 for a first down. However, The Patriots defense held its ground as they had their first stop of the game following an interception in the endzone.

CAL sent in its second team defense late in the first half, and they kept the Patriots off the board with the help of Henry Schmied and Quinn Brakmeier to maintain the 23-point lead going into the break.

CAL started the second half with a 12-yard run by Lowe. The drive was capped off by a 20-yard touchdown run by Blandford. CAL converted a two-point attempt with a jump ball catch by Bayard Donaldson Jr. to put CAL ahead 31-0 and initiate a running clock.

Defensive end Remi Lanham recorded a sack to open the next Patriot possession. Then Luke Schultz brought down the Patriot quarterback with a head of steam on a keeper. Patriots elected to go for it on 4th and 8, but CAL stopped the ball carrier well short of the sticks to force another turnover. De Lessio and Miles Johnston took over at quarterback, and recorded several chunk plays in the running game. De Lessio ultimately found the end zone on a keeper. Preston Burge found the end zone for the extra point to put CAL ahead 38-0 and conclude the scoring.







7th/8th football routs Marnel C. Moorman

CAL's Middle School football team started the 2023 season in style with a 50-0 home victory over Marnel C. Moorman.

The Centurions wasted little time scoring, with Gabriel Lumpkins taking the opening kickoff back 64 yards for a touchdown.

After holding Moorman to a three-

and-out, Jayden Leake took the punt and scampered 54 yards into the end zone and CAL led 16-0 without an offensive snap.

Jackson Burke completed 5-of-7 passes for 122 yards and three touchdowns – two to Man Robinson and one to Boogie Cook.

Hudson Overstreet rounded out the

scoring with a 53-yard run. CAL's defense was just as dominant as its offense, holding Moorman to -3 yards on 35 total plays. Noah Perkins led the way with five tackles.

The middle schoolers have a scheduled game next at home vs Oldham County. Junior varsity starts at 6 pm, followed by varsity at 7:30.

finals. Despite losing several veteran players from the 2022 roster, the 2023 Centurions continued to impress, winning 28-14.

Senior quarterback Cole Hodge, who recently committed to play football for East Carolina University, was 25-for-35 on passing attempts for 302 yards and three touchdown passes. He also led the team in rushing, with 37 yards on eight carries, including one touchdown run.

Hodge connected multiple times with his brother, junior wideout Connor Hodge, who gained 91 yards on nine receptions, including two touchdowns.

Senior wideout Justin Ruffin, who recently committed to play in college for the United State Military Academy at Westpoint, gained an impressive 144 yards on 12 receptions, including one touchdown.

Junior wideout Trey Cotton gained 18 yards on two receptions, and sophomore Jeffrey Vazzana had 16 yards on two receptions. Vazzana also gained 28 yards rushing on the ground, and Trey Cotton rushed for four vards on three carries.

The Centurion defense held the Red Devils scoreless in the first half of play and limited them to just two touchdowns overall.

The CAL defense recorded 67 total tackles, including 11 tackles for a loss of yards and three sacks.

However, CAL faced more obstacles when leading scorer Taylor Touche was taken out by the Mercy keeper as they both raced toward a loose ball just inside the 18-minute mark. Taylor would not play the rest of the game and the CAL squad was faced with finding other scoring options.

Meanwhile, a stellar defensive effort from Addison Chandler, Kynlee Cornett, Anslee Philpot, Zoey Morgan and keeper Sam Durston helped CAL protect the cage for yet another shutout. Midway through the second half, Chandler broke into the scoring column on sheer strength of will, dribbling past clawing Jaguars nearly the length of the field and punching it past the merciless keeper to give CAL the lead.
