Varsity football grounds Eagles in 47-7 win

The Christian Academy of Louisville Centurions returned home Friday to face perennial rival Lexington Christian Academy, a program that had beaten CAL in each of the last two seasons.

This time, the Centurions left no doubt, rolling to a 47–7 victory behind efficient quarterback play, a balanced attack, and a defense that controlled the game from start to finish. The win moves CAL to 3-0 on the season.

Quarterback depth, clean execution

The Centurions' two-quarterback system again proved effective.

Sophomore Jackson Burke completed 12 of 17 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns, adding another 12 rushing yards. Junior Brodie Pfeiffer was equally sharp, finishing 16-of-19 for 153 yards and two touchdowns while also breaking free for 57 rushing yards on three carries, including a 46-yard run. Freshman Will Seifert entered late to keep CAL's depth at quarterback on display.

Playmakers out wide + steady ground game

Junior Ja'Hyde Brown set the tone through the air with nine



receptions for 93 yards and two touchdowns, giving the Centurions key strikes. Classmate Gaines Howard provided significant production with 10 catches for 177 yards and a touchdown. Senior Micah Akin contributed three catches for 28 yards.

Senior Jeffrey Vazzana kept the ground game moving with 50 yards and a touchdown on nine carries, while senior Tyree Stoner added 18 yards and a score.

Additional contributions came from junior Andrew Greene (33 yards), sophomore Jayden Leak (nine yards), and sophomore Noah Perkins, who caught a three-yard touchdown pass.

Defensive balance and disruption Junior linebacker Micah Newsome set the tone with 11 total tackles, including seven assists.

Seniors carried the front-seven dominance from there, with sacks by Jackson Settle, Micah Akin, Brody Cherry, and Chapman Russell keeping the Eagles' backfield under pressure all night.

Wrapping up the day, JV runner Mediss Grasama delivered a strong performance, finishing in 25:08.

The second meeting ended with the same final score, but there were plenty of positives for the Centurions to pull from.

Senior goalie Morgan Lala recorded a massive total of 19 saves. The defense held Sacred Heart scoreless on all 13 of its penalty corners. CAL also put 13 shots on goal in a busy game, led by Savannah Faulkner (3), Amelia Ohr (3), and Lindsey Sloan (2).

The first half ended with the teams tied 0-0.

SHA broke the scoreless tie a couple minutes into the 3rd quarter, but with a little over 3 minutes to go, Eviana Steinrock shot back and buried a goal with an assist from Savannah Faulkner, tying the game 1-1.

Hoping to put one away for the win, the 4th quarter began just as strong as the others. However, with only 2:46 minutes remaining, the Valkyries got on the board again, and CAL was not able to recover.

Sadly, the 2-1 loss does not reflect the hustle, fight and spirit this young Centurion team displayed. As noted by Coach Chris Ward, "We expect excellence from our veteran players, but everyone stepped up last night.
