Varsity football shuts out North Hardin

Varsity football extended its current winning streak to 14 games (dating back to last season) with a commanding 49-0 win over North Hardin High School on Friday night. Senior quarterback Connor Hodge led a balanced offensive attack, completing 16-of-22 passes for 188 yards and two touchdowns. The ground game was just as potent with sophomore running back Garyon Hobbs scoring two rushing touchdowns, including a 23-yard breakaway in the second quarter.

The Centurions wasted no time building an advantage, controlling both sides of the ball to secure a comfortable 35-0 lead by halftime.

Hodge connected with several receivers through the air, including sophomore wideout Ja'Hyde Brown, who hauled in 8 catches for 126 yards and a touchdown. Brown hauled in a 39-yard reception to set the Centurions up at the goal line, then he capped off the drive with a 1-yard touchdown reception just before halftime. Senior wide receiver Trey Cotton contributed two receptions for 14 yards and a touchdown, and junior wideout Stone Perkins added 36 yards on three catches, consistently moving the chains.

On the ground, Hobbs carried the ball eight times for 43 yards and two touchdowns, providing the Centurions with a reli-

able ground attack. Hodge contributed with his legs as well, rushing for 45 yards and a touchdown on nine carries, further showcasing his dual-threat ability. Junior Tyree Stoner also shined, scoring a rushing touchdown and adding 26 yards on two carries.

The defense was impenetrable, led by junior linebacker Jackson Settle and junior defensive lineman Jason Hilliard. Settle, Hilliard, and junior linebacker Andrew Greene each recorded sacks, while sophomore cornerback Jayson Ruffin and freshman cornerback Man Robinson both snagged interceptions for a Centurion defense that held North Hardin to just 24 yards of total offense.

Centurion fans got an exciting preview of the future when freshman quarterback Jackson Burke stepped into the spotlight during the second half. Burke showcased poise and precision beyond his years, completing all four of his pass attempts, highlighted by a stunning 51-yard touchdown strike to senior tight end Joel Green. The play not only energized the crowd but also showed the depth and potential of the Centurions' offense.

The Centurions return to action next Friday, Sept. 13, when they travel to face Lexington Christian Academy. Kickoff is at 7:30 p.m. Be sure to come out and support the team as they look to stay perfect on the year!

Varsity girls soccer wins sixth straight

Girls varsity soccer team took on the Whitefield Academy Wildcats Tuesday, Sept. 3.

CAL got off to a fast start behind a stunning goal by Addison Chandler, who fired an impressive strike to put the Centurions ahead 1-0 less than 10 minutes in.

The midfield was expertly controlled by Liliana Turoso and Lydia Wallace, allowing the team to maintain possession and momentum throughout the match.

As the first half neared its end, Blakely Touche' delivered a goal on a left-footed shot with just five minutes remaining, pushing CAL's advantage to 3-0.

Early in the second half Chandler put a shot on goal off of a Taylor Touche corner kick that ultimately resulted in an own goal by the Wildcats.

CAL's defensive line was impenetrable, with goalkeepers Grace Hureau and Christina Schroering seeing little action thanks to the defenders' efforts shutting down Whitefield's offense.

Taylor Touché later added to the CAL lead with a perfectly executed goal assisted by Chandler, making the score 5-0.

A handball by a Whitefield defender in the penalty box led to a penalty kick, which CAL converted to round out the scoring in a 6-0 victory.

The CAL Girls Varsity Soccer team faced a tough test against Lexington Christian on Thursday night, ultimately suffering their first loss of the season in a tightly fought 3-2 match.

Varsity cross country competed in cool weather for the first time this season at Rumble Through the Jungle at Creasy Mahan Park in Goshen, KY on Saturday, Sept. 7.

The meet was highlighted by top 10 finishes in the boys and girls divisions. Senior Sam Herbig finished in 7th place out of 340 runners with a time of 16:29. Junior Anabelle Plummer finished in 10th place with a time of 19:50 in a field of 197 runners on a difficult course.

The CAL boys team finished 21st out of 38 teams in a competitive field. After Sam, sophomore Jackson Fitzgerald finished 115th with a time of 18:56. Finishing in 155th was junior Ethan Fitzgibbon with a time of 19:42. Senior Jeremiah Beardsley finished 178th with a time of 20:09. Senior Luke Stephens finished 204th with a time of 20:48. Junior Elijah Nelson

finished 222nd with a time of 21:20. Sophomore John Coutts finished in 233rd with a time of 21:34. Senior Ryder Peralta finished 259th with a time of 23:14. Rounding out the CAL team was junior Cole Shirley with a time of 23:34 good for 262nd place.

The CAL girls team finished a strong 13th out of 23 in a very competitive field. Following Anabelle's lead was Senior Taylor Greenwell with a 61st place finish in a time of 22:35. Sophomore Kinsley Cordrey finished in 90th place with a time of 23:44. Junior Reese Fletcher literally finished on Kinsley's heels with a 91st place finish and time of 23:44.
