
HS boys golf wins 2A state, Judd wins individual title

The high school boys golf team captured its fourth 2A state title in five years last Monday at Owensboro Country Club.

The Centurions shot a 302 (+14) as a team to win the event by 13 strokes.

CAL was led by senior Will Judd, who registered a 68 (-4) to win the individual title. Judd is the fourth CAL golfer to win the tournament in the last five years.

Zach Gladieux finished 6th with a 75, followed by Campbell Parsons (79), Parker Brandon (80) and Jake Elliott (80) for CAL.



The Centurions will face another test on Sept. 23 when they travel to Nevel Meade for the highly-competi-



tive 6th Region tournament. CAL most recently won the event in 2023.

Varsity volleyball finishes 3rd at 2A State

In a game that lived up to its billing, CAL held off a late Raider rally for a 34-27 victory, improving to 4-0 and adding another high-profile win to their résumé.

Quarterback depth, clean execution

Sophomore Jackson Burke set the tone, completing 19-of-27 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns. Junior Brodie Pfeiffer added 80 passing yards on 6-of-7 accuracy.

Senior running back Tyree Stoner even got in on the act with a 20-yard completion on a trick play early, fueling CAL's momentum early in the game.

Together, the Centurions threw for 394 yards, keeping Ryle's defense stretched sideline to sideline.

Playmakers out wide + steady ground game

Junior Ja'Hyde Brown provided a spark with eight receptions for 153 yards and added a 99-yard kick-off return touchdown that flipped momentum in the third quarter.

Classmate Gaines Howard was equally effective, pulling in 10 catches for 132 yards and a touchdown.

Senior Jeffrey Vazzana contributed 15 receiving yards and a score, while senior Micah Akin chipped in three grabs for 57 yards. On the ground, Stoner rushed for 40 yards and a touchdown, with Vazzana adding 11 and sophomore Noah Perkins picking up 7. **Defensive grit against 6A firepower**

Junior linebacker Micah Newsome led all tacklers with 17 stops (10 solo), setting the defensive tone against Ryle's balanced attack. Senior Stone Perkins followed with 14 tackles, while seniors Jackson Settle, Brody Cherry, and Chapman Russell each recorded sacks to keep the Raiders off balance.

Senior Jason Hilliard anchored the line, and juniors Eric Jones and Jayson Ruffin provided consistent support in the secondary.

Sophomore Gabriel Lumpkin added a key stop as CAL's defense weathered a strong fourth-quarter push. **Special teams steady**

Junior kicker Madden Miller was perfect on the night, converting all four extra points and hitting both of his field goal attempts.

Combined with Brown's electrifying return, CAL's special teams proved decisive in a tight matchup.

Next step

The win over Ryle, a perennial 6A power ranked in Kentucky's top ten, reinforces CAL's status as one of the state's most complete teams regardless of classification.

Now 4-0, the Centurions return home Friday for homecoming against Central Hardin, aiming to extend their unbeaten run as the drive for a fourth straight Class 3A championship continues.

Freshman volleyball improves to 7-0

The freshman volleyball team stayed perfect last week with a 2-0 week.

The Centurions kicked off the week with a home win over the Oldham County Colonels (21-16, 21-13) on Monday. The Centurions overcame a 5-point deficit in the first set and never looked back.

The next day, the Shelby County Rockets came to CAL, and the home team prevailed again (21-11, 21-13). Every combination of Lady Centurions overwhelmed their opponent on their way to improving to an impressive 7-0 record the season.

On the girls' side, Kinsley Cordrey led the way with a dominant first-place

finish, crossing the line in 17:46. Her performance set a confident tone for the team. She was followed by Reese Fletcher, who placed 33rd with a time of 21:14, and Jillian Besore, who ran a solid 21:35. McKenley Stine rounded out the girls' squad with a time of 26:31. Each athlete showed resilience and steady improvement as the season progresses.
