
# Varsity boys golf wins 2A state tournament Faulkner wins individual tournament

CAL competed for the 2A Championship last Monday Owensboro, KY. The Centurions entered the tournament having won the championship three times, so anything less would have been a surprise.

CAL delivered, shooting a low round of 296 (+8) at Owensboro Country Club to beat top rival Taylor County by seven strokes and win the team title. CAL and Taylor County have shared the spotlight for the tournament's history.

CAL was led by eighth grader Brady Faulkner, who shot a 70 (-2) score to beat out his teammate Will Judd's 72 (+0) for the individual title. Falkner hit every green in regulation until the 18th, when he got up and down to finish.

# Varsity girls soccer advances to 2A state final four

The varsity girls soccer team made an emphatic statement this week, advancing to the final four of the 2A state tournament after a commanding 7-0 victory at Warren East on Saturday in a match up that pitted CALs defense against Deca Burr, last year's state goal leader.

From the opening whistle, CAL controlled the pace of the game with Taylor Touche driving up the middle of the field for an incredible solo run. The senior took the ball

over half the field straight to the net for the game's first goal. The early strike energized the team and set the tone for the rest of the match.

CAL's second goal came from a beautifully executed corner kick by Addison Chandler. The ball soared toward the back corner, where Zoey Morgan's header connected and sent the ball toward the edge of the goal. Blakely Touche chased the ball across the line to prevent it

## Varsity football suffers first loss

In a tightly contested game, Christian Academy of Louisville (CAL) suffered their first loss of the season last Friday, falling 41-34 to Lexington Christian Academy (LCA) on Friday night.

Senior quarterback Connor Hodge put on an impressive performance, throwing for 469 yards and four touchdowns while also rushing for a touchdown and completing a two-point conversion.

Despite CAL's offensive firepower, the Centurions struggled to contain LCA's explosive rushing attack, which amassed 340 yards and ultimately proved to be the deciding factor in the game.

Hodge connected with a variety of Centurion receivers, led by senior wide receiver Trey Cotton, who hauled in 16 receptions for 277 yards and three touchdowns, including a late-game 45-yard score that brought the Centurions within striking distance. Junior wideout Stone Perkins contributed two receptions for 82 yards, including a

momentum-shifting 77-yard touchdown that energized the CAL sideline in the second quarter.

Sophomore running back Garyon Hobbs added an efficient 59 rushing yards on five carries while contributing 20 receiving yards on three catches.

Junior linebacker Chapman Russell and sophomore linebacker Garyon Hobbs led the defense with 11 total tackles each, followed by senior defensive back Trey Cotton with 10 tackles. Junior defensive backs

Grayden Reid and Tyree Stoner made solid contributions, recording nine and six tackles, respectively. Freshman cornerback Man Robinson showcased his playmaking ability with an interception in the end zone that temporarily halted LCA's offensive momentum.

The Centurions will look to rebound next week, as they return home to face Ryle on Friday, Sept. 20. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. at Christian Academy.

The win punched CAL's ticket to the 2A state semifinals, where they'll face Estill County in Owensboro this Saturday.

Three days earlier, CAL rolled past John Hardin 7-0 to win the 2A Section Three tournament.

CAL kicked off the game

with Addison Chandler finding the back of the net on a perfectly executed corner kick just five minutes into the match.

Two minutes later, Hadley Snowden and Taylor Touche' pulled off a brilliant give-andgo maneuver that saw Touche' take a shot that bounced off the post. Not giving up on the play after the misfire, she hustled to the ball and put it in to push CAL's lead to 2-0.

CAL continued their aggressive play with a throw-in from Lydia Wallace to Blakely Touche' that set up another scoring chance. B. Touche's shot bounced off the Charger goalie's foot but rolled to Addie Schlierf, who capitalized on the opportunity to stretch the lead to 3-0.

With just 30 seconds left before halftime, Zoey Morgan delivered another powerful throw-in to Taylor Touche', who struck again, this time with a shot that deflected off the goalkeeper's hands and into the net, giving CAL a comfortable 4-0 lead at the break.

CAL's dominance continued into the second half, as Hadley Snowden scored to increase the lead to 5-0. The Centurions teamwork and passing were on full display in the closing minutes of the match. A smooth passing sequence between Haylie Lesperance, Lydia Wallace, Olivia Hill, and Jordan Aiken ended with a cross to Abigail Franks. Franks' shot bounced off the post, but Haylie Springer was in perfect position to follow it up with the final goal of the evening.

CAL's defense, led by Zoey Morgan, Anslee Philpot, Lydia Wallace, and Kinlee Cornett, put on an exceptional display of aggressiveness,









holding the John Hardin Bulldogs scoreless in the championship game.

Addison Chandler, Anslee Philpot and Taylor Touche', were honored after the game for their outstanding performances during the tournament.

The Centurions also played a regular season game last week, earning a 2-2 tie at Bullitt East on Monday.

From the first whistle, the game was a display of aggressive, fast-paced soccer, with both teams pushing the limits of endurance and strategy.

CAL struck first with a beautifully placed shot by Hadley Snowden just over the Chargers goalkeeper, setting the tone for the match. Taylor Touché showed off her speed by sprinting past the Chargers' defense to score off a shot by Snowden up the middle. Her timely run and finish stretched the Centurions lead to 2-0.

Bullitt East scored with 15 minutes left in the first half to inch closer at 2-1, which was the score at halftime.

Playing in the toughest region in the state, CAL improved their chances of advancing past region competition though there is some work to do. The top two

teams advance and Trinity, St. X, South Oldham, and Eastern share the same hope for the region tournament September 23 at Seneca Golf Course. CAL finished third in the region last year.

Two weekends ago, CAL finished tied in fifth place in the 53rd Bowling Green Invitational at this year's state tournament course, Bowling Green Country Club.

state tournament feel, with a 7 a.m. start time and crisp autumn temperatures. The field featured the best teams from around the state, including each of the top five teams.

CAL's Will Judd won the individual tournament with the only under-par score for the day of 70 (-2). Judd played at a distinguished level late with birdies on his last four holes on a course

with fast greens and gusty winds. The win was his second medalist honor in three weeks.

St. X recorded the low team score of 298 (+10). Madison Central, last year's state champions, took second with a 299 (+11). CAL shot a 304 (+14), followed by Trinity with a 304 (+16).
