


The varsity softball team is hosting a pancake breakfast fundraiser on Nov. 18 in the CAL cafeteria.

Varsity football comes back to win at Ryle

The CAL varsity football team traveled to Northern Kentucky on Friday night to face the Raiders of Ryle High School.

Despite struggling in the first half, CAL battled back in the fourth quarter to win their fourth game of the season by a final score of 34-22.

Senior quarterback Cole Hodge completed 22-of-30 passes for 202 yards and connected with his brother, junior wideout Connor Hodge, for two touchdowns.

Connor Hodge ended the night with a total of 12 receptions for 100 yards and two touchdowns. Senior wideout Justin Ruffin had eight receptions for a total of 81 yards.

Cole Hodge led the game on the ground for the Centurions with 14 rushing attempts for a total of 71 yards. Sophomore running back Jeffrey

Vazzana recorded two touchdowns and 22 yards on seven carries, and freshman Garyon Hobbs ran the ball two times for a total of 17 yards.

The Centurion defense had three fumble recoveries, an interception, three defensive sacks and a total of 56 tackles, including 10 tackles for a loss.

Senior linebacker Connor Franklin and freshman linebacker Garyon Hobbs forced two fumbles. Hobbs. sophomore linebacker Chapman Russell and senior defensive lineman Alex Ullom all recovered fumbles. Ullom returned his recovery 20 yards to the end zone for a game-clinching touchdown late in the fourth quarter.

Freshman defensive back Gaines Howard recorded his second interception of the season, giving the CAL offense a short field to

score their first touchdown of the game. Franklin led the team in tackles, with nine total, followed by Hobbs, senior defensive lineman David Holloway, and Ruffin, with five tackles each.

Faulkner's overnight adjustments helped the Centurions to be in the hunt in the

"Faulkner has been a steady player at such a young age. He knows the game and he understands how to make shots," Zimmerer said. "As he grows, gets stronger, and executes at an even higher level, his career can

be impressive. I am always impressed by his humble coachable spirit."

CAL's second-day comeback was aided by another seventh grader in Luke Elliott. He finished at +4 (75). After having a tough round on Saturday, Elliott started and finished consistently on Sunday to help the team climb the leaderboard.

Gladieux gave a winning effort as well. After finishing in a tie for first a week prior, Zach was given an opportunity to play in the KGCA championship. His firstround performance of 78 (+6) was solid.

CAL will begin the postseason at the Sixth Region Tournament at Oxmoor Country Club on Tuesday, Sept. 19. CAL will need to come prepared to compete in what is arguably the toughest region in the state, as only the top two teams advance to semi-state.

CAL attempted a sneaky onside kick at the end of the first quarter but were not successful.

The next CAL drive started on the HP 20-yard line and ended in a punt.
