



## Varsity volleyball wins 2A state title

The varsity volleyball captured the first 2A state title last weekend at Kentucky Wesleyan.

The Centurions ran the table against three stellar opponents to win the championship.

The journey began on Thursday, when CAL rolled past Calloway County 3-0 (25-6, 25-9, 25-13) in the tournament quarterfinals.

The Centurions looked like they'd cruise again in the semifinals, as they won the first two sets against Franklin County 25-18 and 25-14. However, the Flyers battled back to win the next

two sets and force a decisive fifth set. CAL dug deep and prevailed 15-8 in the final set to advance to the finals.

CAL faced more adversity early in the championship, dropping the first set to Taylor County 25-23. The Centurions responded well again, winning the next three sets 25-20, 25-16 and 25-15 to win the title.

Freshman Kayleigh Rogers was named the tournament MVP after recording 55 kills and 47 digs in the three games.

Seniors Ella Baker, Kate Chase and Caroline Bates and junior Katrina Os-



wald were all named to the all-tournament team as well.

With the three wins, coupled with victories over

Eastern and Spencer County earlier in the week, CAL improved to 18-2 on the season.

## Varsity boys golf wins region tournament

The varsity boys golf team captured the Region Six tournament for the first time since 2021 on Monday. Playing at historic Seneca Golf Course, CAL battled the top teams in the region and prevailed with a team score of 287 (-1).

That score bested runner up Trinity by four strokes and third place St. X by five.

Coming into the tournament, CAL was ranked fourth in the region behind St. X, Trinity, and

South Oldham. However, the top teams' finishes had been close over the last few weeks of the season.

CAL was led by Will Judd's round of 69 (-3), which earned him the individual championship. The clutch performance was important for the junior, who has shown his tenacity throughout the season.

Judd finished fourth in the region last year and hopes to continue the run of individual state champions

# Varsity girls soccer wins a pair

The varsity girls soccer team earned a pair of road wins last week.

They started the week with a 4-0 victory at Meade County on Monday.

The match began with CAL taking control of the first half, keeping the ball predominantly on their side. The Greenwave managed only a few shots, all expertly stopped by goalie Christina Schroering.

With under 10 minutes left in the first half, Addison Chandler controlled the ball with a cross to Blakely Touche, who scored CAL's first goal. Just two minutes before halftime, a powerful punt from Schroering landed at midfield, where Taylor Touche' controlled it and assisted Blakely Touche' on her second goal of the game to give CAL a 2-0 lead at halftime.

In the second half, B. Touche' and Addy Schlierf displayed teamwork when B. Touche' passed to Schlierf, who dazzled with footwork before returning

the ball to B. Touche' for her third goal on a precise left-footed shot.

Later in the half, Hadley Snowden assisted B. Touche' with a toe tap that rolled the ball right into the goal for B. Touche' fourth score of the night.

Though the Greenwave's goalkeeper showed impressive agility, stopping several CAL attempts, Meade County couldn't break through CAL's defense. Anchored by a vocal Schroering, defenders Annslee Philpot, Kinley Cornett, Hayley Springer, Zoey Morgan, and Lydia Wallace held firm. CAL's defense kept the Greenwaves scoreless, securing a 4-0 victory. On Thursday, CAL hit the road again for a district matchup at Ballard. CAL struck first eight minutes into an action-packed game when Lydia Wallace showcased her strength with a powerful throw-in to Blakely Touche', who assisted Taylor Touche' for CAL's first goal.



Moments later, Blakely Touche' took a shot that went wide, but the Bruins' goalie mishandled the strike, allowing Addy Schlierf to pounce and tap in CAL's second goal to extend the lead to 2-0. The Bruins responded quickly with a goal to bring the game to 2-1 at halftime. In the second half, Haylie Lesperance dazzled fans with impressive offensive dribbling. However, a no-call after some contact gave the Bruins an opportunity to push forward, leading to their second goal that leveled the match at 2-2. With just three minutes left, Addison Chandler took a crucial corner kick, perfectly placing the ball for Schlierf, who skillfully kned it in for her second goal of the night to seal the win for CAL at 3-2. Goalkeeper Christine Schroering had a busy night, making crucial saves to protect the lead. Despite the Bruins' aggressive play, CAL demonstrated resilience and teamwork, setting a promising tone for the rest of the season.

# Varsity football falters late against Ryle

Varsity football suffered its second loss of the season in a hard-fought game on Friday night, falling to Ryle 28-24.

CAL dominated time of possession and led late into the second half, but the Centurions couldn't hold off the Raiders' determined fourth-quarter comeback.

Senior quarterback Connor Hodge once again led the offense with an impressive performance, completing 23-of-36 passes for 227 yards. Hodge also demonstrated his mobility, rushing for 135 yards on 19 carries, including two rushing touchdowns. His dual-threat ability kept Ryle's defense on their heels throughout

the game.

Sophomore wide-out Ja'Hyde Brown had a strong showing with 6 catches for 74 yards. Junior wide receiver Stone Perkins added 5 receptions for 65 yards. Senior wide receiver Trey Cotton contributed 52 yards on 3 receptions. All three pass catchers played pivotal roles in keeping the chains moving.

Junior running back Jeffery Vazana returned from a pre-season injury to contribute with a 1-yard touchdown run that gave CAL the advantage early in the game.

Junior linebacker Jackson Settle led the defense with 8 total tackles, anchoring the Centurions' defensive efforts. Senior defen-

sive back Trey Cotton and sophomore linebacker Garyon Hobbs each contributed 5 tackles.

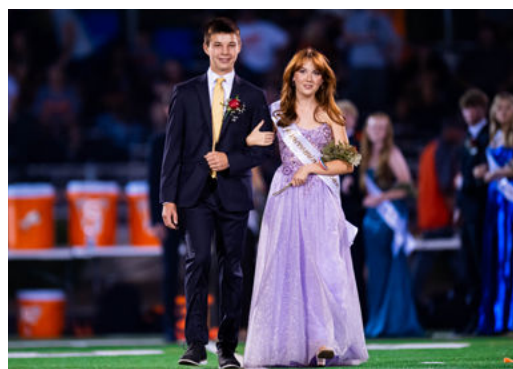
Senior safety Connor Hodge and junior defensive lineman Jason Hilliard each recorded interceptions, making key defensive plays that temporarily halted Ryle's offense.

Despite these efforts, Ryle's offense found their rhythm in the final quarter, scoring 21 unanswered points – including a 66-yard pass that sparked the run – to end the game.

The Centurions will look to rebound next week as they take on Manual High School on Sept. 27. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. at DuPont Manual Stadium.

In addition to Judd, freshman Campbell Parsons had an amazing day, finishing tied for 6th with a 72 (+0). Parsons closed his round with a birdie on the 17th hole.

Eighth grader Lucas Elliott finished with two birdies in the last three holes to close the door on last year's region champion, South Oldham.

Another eighth grader, Brady Faulkner, finished with a 73 (+1). Faulkner was a KHSAA qualifier last year. Faulkner already has one state title under his belt this year, as he shot the low round in the 2A state championship earlier this month. He hopes that experience will propel him in the KHSAA state tournament.

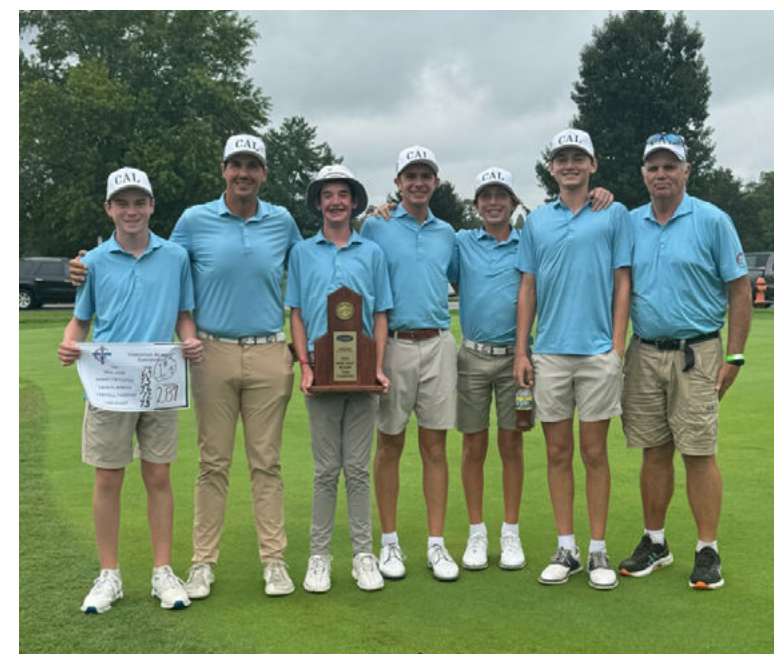
Sophomore Zach Gladieux rounded out the squad

with a 76 (+4). Gladieux has been a steady producer all year for CAL in a sport where all players' contributions are weighed equally on the scoreboard.

Winning the region in his first season with the program, Coach Lucas Holland was thrilled with his players' performance in a tough competitive setting.

"We talked about being able to handle situations like this," coach Holland said. "The verse I shared with them today was Phillippians 4:11-12, to be content in every situation. I knew there would be tough moments. How you handle tough moments can make the difference in success."

CAL advances to the first round of the KHSAA state tournament, which is set to take place on Sept. 30 at Shelbyville Country Club. The tournament will feature the top two teams from four regions with the top three teams advancing to the state finals. This is the first time for CAL has reached this level as a team since the KHSAA began this format



two years ago.

CAL competed at Shelbyville CC early in the season, albeit without two key players in Judd and Faulkner. Besides Trinity who, St. Henry and Highlands from the Northern Kentucky region are considered to be the Centurions' top competition in the event.

"The next round should be impressive. St. Henry is strong and won the ALL A state championship at Gibson Bay while we were winning the 2A tournament

in Owensboro," Holland said. "Trinity has been tough all season and has truthfully been slightly better than us, We seem to be playing our best golf at the right time. We need the same kind of effort as today to get back to Bowling Green"

If CAL finishes inside the top three, they will head to Bowling Green Country Club for the state tournament on Oct. 7-9. CAL last won the region in 2021 when they went on to win the state title.

Paul Favors made an interception with three minutes left in the half to set Wescott up for a 25-yard

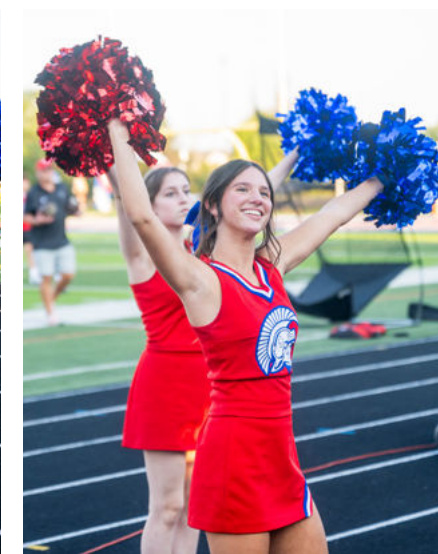

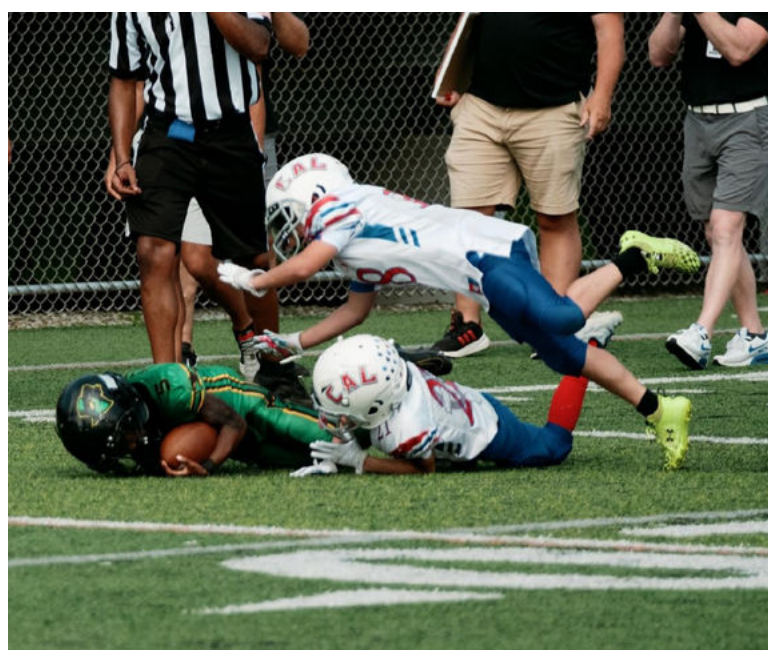
