CAL dominated the game from the start, leading at halftime 41-7 before cruising to an easy victory with a final score of 52-36.

Senior quarterback Cole

Hodge completed 24-of-33 passes for 363 yards and five touchdowns to four different receivers.

Junior wideout Connor Hodge had 11 receptions for 162 yards, one touchdown, and one 2-point conversion. Senior wideout Justin Ruffin had six receptions for 84 yards and one touchdown.

HS boys golf to send three to semi-state Team falls one stroke short of qualification

CAL's golf dreams of a return to the state golf championships came up just short on Tuesday afternoon at Oxmoor Country Club.

CAL finished with a 293 (+5), good for third place behind a great performance of Sixth Region champions South Oldham who shot 285 (-3) and St. Xavier at 292 (+4).

The region winner and runner-up

advance to the next round on Sept. 26 at the Willows course of Kenton County, KY. The top 10 individuals not part of these two teams also advance.

CAL was led by sophomore Will Judd, who continued to be a steady competitor with a score of 70 (-2). Judd scored four birdies in the round, including three on the back nine. He finished fourth overall and

will advance on to the first round of the state tournament next week.

Senior Brady Smith also shot well enough to advance for the second year in a row. He finished 10th with a 73 (+1). This puts him one step closer to defending his state title from last year.

Seventh grader Brady Faulkner finished with a 74 (+2).

CAL entered the penultimate week of the regular season with three matches, starting Tuesday with a road game against powerhouse Floyd Central. The Centurions came out with great energy and movement, seeming to surprise the Highlanders with a 0-0 tie at halftime.

Play was back and forth and remained scoreless through the first five minutes of the second half until a handball was called against the Centurions, giving the High-

landers a penalty kick that they converted to take a 1-0 lead.

CAL stayed strong and kept the Highlanders away from the goal for most of the game. In the end, CAL threatened but was unable to score and fell 2-0.

Thursday night, CAL returned home for senior night and a match against a strong Providence (Indiana) squad.

Prior to the game, the Centurions honored four seniors: Sa-

mantha Durston, Ella Mast, Elise Michel, and Ashlyn Toby.*

This one was a defensive battle, and the Centurions were up to the task with excellent play by the on the back line from Anslee Philpott, Kynlee Cornett, Zoey Morgan, and Lydia Wallace.

By the end of the game, CAL was without three starters lost to injury but fought valiantly against a talented squad from across the river despite losing a close contest 1-0.

CAL benefitted

from stellar play by goalkeeper Sam Durston, who finished with seven saves, including several acrobatic efforts that left the CAL faithful with their jaws on the grass.

CAL wrapped up the week with a cage match against the Bulldogs of Male High School.

Down five starters, the Centurions showed their depth and resilience.

CAL led 1-0 at the half on a corner kick goal by Olivia Hill and got the insurance goal on a deep shot from

Zoey Morgan in the second half to give the Centurions the 2-0 victory.

CAL enters the last week of their regular season with a record of 8-5-4 and has already clinched top seed in the district.

The Centurions round out the regular season slate with a road match against LaRue County Monday night and a home match against North Oldham Thursday night.

Vazzana had two additional touchdowns on the ground, finishing the night

with 77 yards rushing on 15 carries. Recently ranked by ESPN as the 27th-best dual-threat quarterback in the nation, Cole Hodge led the team on the ground with 84 yards on 11 carries. Freshman running back Garyon Hobbs also scored a touchdown on offense just after he recovered a fumble on defense and was stopped just

short of the goal line.

Sophomore cornerback Stone Perkins led the Centurion defense in tackles with seven, followed by Hobbs with six total tackles. Ruffin, sophomore linebacker Chapman Russell, and freshman defensive back Gaines Howard each had four total tackles.

Senior defensive linemen

Nathan Carlisle and Nathan Ehrenborg both recorded a sack for a 13-yard and seven-yard loss, respectively. Ruffin and Russell each recorded two pass deflections, and Howard notched one.

CAL's middle school football team remained unbeaten with a 42-6 win over visiting North Oldham.

Noah Perkins ran for 108 yards on just three carries, with all three rushes going for touchdowns. Perkins excelled in the defensive side of the ball as well with three solo tackles and two assists.

Jackson Burke completed 8-of-13 passes for 147 yards and one touchdown to Jayden Leake. Burke threw two interceptions, the first picks he's thrown this year. One of them returned for a touchdown for North Oldham's only score. Burke has been nearly flawless this season going into this game and is still completing just over 70% of his passes with 20 touchdowns.

With the start of the

fourth quarter beginning and the Centurions ahead 36-6, Man Robinson intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown.

In somewhat of a bizarre ending, the North Oldham coaching staff told the game officials they were done and apparently seen enough with 7:50 left to play. After a little confusion, the players shook hands and called it a night.

The JV looked just as impressive with a 26-0 shutout. They have yet to be scored on in three games this year. North Oldham only mustered 58 total yards on 32 plays. Easton Edgell led the Centurions with five tackles.
