## Varsity football rolls past Manual

In a matchup that was moved up a day due to the threat of severe weather from Hurricane Helene, it was the Christian Academy of Louisville (CAL) Centurions who brought the real storm to DuPont Manual Stadium Thursday night.

From the start, CAL overpowered DuPont Manual in a commanding 35-10 victory to improve their record to 4-2.

Senior quarterback Connor Hodge led the offense with precision, completing 12-of-23 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns. Hodge also added a 3-yard

rushing touchdown, giving CAL a crucial early lead.

Sophomore running back Garyon Hobbs turned in an explosive performance, hauling in three receptions for 111 yards, including a stunning 88-yard touchdown that broke the game open in the second quarter. Hobbs also contributed 27 rushing yards on five carries.

Junior running back Jeffery Vazzana added 28 rushing yards on four attempts, providing a reliable ground option throughout the game. Senior wide receiver Bryce

# Varsity girls soccer reaches 2A state finals

On Saturday, Sept. 21, 2024, the CAL girls varsity soccer team faced off against the Estill County Engineers in the 2A state semifinals.

The game started off with a bang, as Taylor Touché wasted no time scoring the first goal within the first three minutes by outmaneuvering the Engineers' defense. Shortly after, Lydia Wallace's high kick into the box created an opportunity that Blakely Touché and Taylor Touché capitalized on, working together to

break through three defenders and the goalie for CAL's second goal.

The momentum continued when Addison Chandler was fouled inside the box, earning a penalty kick that extended CAL's lead to 3-0 within the first 10 minutes of the game.

Despite a goalless second half and the challenging heat, CAL's defense held strong, keeping the Engineers off the scoreboard and securing the win.

Tickets are \$7 and will be on sale at this Friday's home football game. Contact CAL softball coach Kyle Mullin for more information.



## Varsity boys golf advances to state tournament

The varsity boys golf team took the next step in the journey to the KHSAA state tournament Monday in the semi-state round at Shelbyville Country Club. CAL joined the winners and runner-ups from the four surrounding regions, with the top three teams for a round that would send the top three teams to the state finals.

After a thirty minute fog delay, CAL golfers set out to earn a trip to Bowling Green for the second time this year. By the end of the day, CAL had accomplished that goal with a solid score of 303 (+15) that earned a second place finish to secure a spot in the state tournament.

CAL was runners-up to Louisville rival and fellow Sixth Region representative Trinity, who shot a 298. St. Henry placed third and will also travel to Bowling Green. All three teams advance to play at Bowling Green Country Club on October 8-9 in a 36 hole



competition for the state championship.

With the recent rain, the semi-state course played more challenging than usual with longer fairway grass and slower greens at times.

CAL was led once again by junior Will Judd, who finished with a score of -2 (70). This placed him tied for second individually. Judd ended the round with a string of three birdies after maintaining a solid performance throughout the afternoon. Judd was the Sixth Region medalist last week

and should be one of the top encouragement as the day contenders next week to win ended. the state title.

Sophomore Zach Gladieux progressed nicely through his day, making dependable tee shots and putts. Gladieux finished ninth with a + 2 (74) to provide the necessary support to power CAL into the top three. Freshman Cambell Parsons (78), 8th grader Luke Elliott (80), and 8th grader Brady Faulkner (82) rounded out the scores for CAL.

"Survive and advance" seemed to be the departing

CAL should be one of the favorites at the state tournament despite the disappointing finish in the semi-state round. The Centurions are hunting for their first KHSAA state title since 2021.

CAL played at the KH-SAA state site in Bowling Green recently and finished in a tie with Trinity for third. Will Judd won that tournament, which took place on Sept. 7.

Wilson added a 52-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter to set the tone early for the Centurions, and junior wideout Trey Cotton contributed three catches for 81 yards and a touchdown.

The Centurions' defense allowed only 10 points, with Manual's lone touchdown coming late in the third quarter. The Crimsons struggled to generate consistent offense against CAL's stifling defense, finishing with just 62 total yards compared to CAL's 350 yards.

Freshman defensive back Man Robinson led the defense with nine total

tackles, consistently disrupting Manual's offensive flow throughout the game. Robinson was joined by several other key contributors, including senior defensive back Trey Cotton, who recorded seven tackles and one solo tackle for loss.

Junior linebacker Chapman Russell and sophomore linebacker Garyon Hobbs added six tackles each, with Russell recording a sack and tackle for loss alongside fellow junior linebacker Jackson Settle.

From the opening minutes, the intensity was high, and Blakely Touche broke through the Rebel defense to score the first goal for CAL.

However, the Rebels responded quickly and aggressively, scoring three goals in rapid succession to take a 3-1 lead.

Undeterred, Blakely Touche and Addison Chandler worked together to bring CAL back into the game. Chandler followed a deflection by the Boyle County goalie with a tap-in for CAL's second goal.

The momentum was short lived, as Boyle County answered with two more

goals of its own to take a 5-2 lead into halftime.

The Rebels extended their lead to 6-2 after halftime, but in a quick response, Taylor and Blakely Touche teamed up with a string of precise passes that culminated in a goal for Taylor to bring CAL closer. Hadley Snowden drew a foul in the penalty box later in the half that resulted in CAL's fourth goal.

Playing through rain and fatigue in their third game in four days, the Centurions couldn't complete the comeback, and Boyle County won the 2A state championship.

Like her teammates, CAL goalie Grace Hureau displayed impressive stamina with numerous saves

throughout the back-andforth game.

There was no rest for the weary, as CAL returned home to face the DuPont Manual Crimsons the day after the 2A state finals on Monday, Sept. 23. The game kicked off with

high energy and aggressiveness from both sides as the teams went head-to-head. The Crimsons showcased impressive footwork and speed, making it a challenging start for CAL.

With neither side having scored about 20 minutes into the match, Taylor Touche' earned a penalty kick in the box. She remained composed and confidently made the shot, putting CAL on the board with the first goal of the game.

Just before halftime, Manual gained momentum, scoring a few goals that sailed just over CAL's keeper, Grace Hureau. Early in the second half, the Crimsons connected with a quick one-two pass, allowing their forward to find the back of the net to push the visitors' lead to 4-1.

Blakely Touche' kept CAL in the fight, playing a bounce pass off Addison Chandler and driving it in for CAL's second goal of the night. Grace Hureau made several crucial saves. and CAL's defense worked tirelessly to keep up with Manual's relentless offense.

Despite their best efforts, CAL fell short in a hardfought game by a final score of 5-2.
