



HS girls soccer wins 2nd straight district title

The varsity girls soccer team brought home the district title last week with wins over Eastern and Ballard!

Ballard beat CAL during the regular season, but CAL came away with a strong performance in the district finals rematch to win 3-1.

Blakely Touche scored all 3 goals for the Centurions in the championship and was supported with outstanding play on offense by Kaylee McClure, Morgan Evans, Liliana Turoso, Brooklyn McAlister, Rory Ross, and Olivia Hill.

The defensive prowess of Zoey Morgan, Kynlee Cornett, Lydia Wallace, and Jordan Akin frustrated the Eagle and Bruin offenses in both games, with Grace Hureau having a dominating performance in the goal box.

Regional play began on Monday, October 13, as the girls defeated the Male Bulldogs 3-2 (writeup coming next week) and will play Manual in the semifinals on Wednesday at 5:30 p.m. at Waggener.



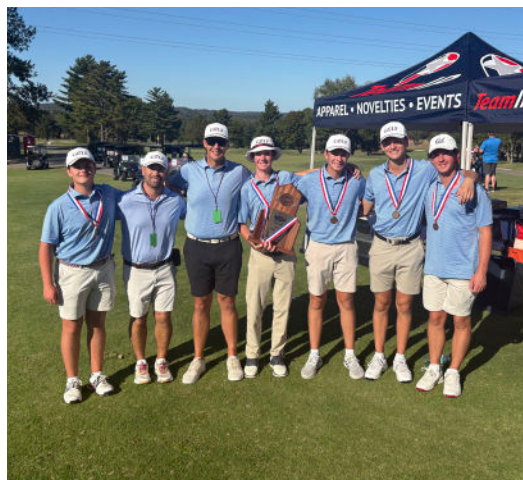
HS boys golf takes 4th at state

The high school boys golf team concluded the 2025 season with a strong showing at the KHSAA state tournament last Friday and Saturday at Bowling Green Country Club.

The Centurions finished the two-day event in fourth place as a team with a total score of 301 (+25). CAL finished four strokes behind third place McCracken County and well ahead of fifth place Marshall County (+43).

Will Judd paced CAL in 11th place with a final score of 148 (+4). Hot on his heels was Zach Gladieux at 149 (+5) in 13th place. Parker Brandon finished one stroke behind Gladieux in 18th place. Jake Elliot notched CAL's final counting score with a 154 (+10).

The tournament marks the end of an outstanding campaign for the Centurions that included a 2A state title among several other standout efforts.

Varsity football cruises past Central

Efficient offense, familiar rhythm

Christian Academy of Louisville extended its unbeaten streak Friday night with a convincing 49–7 win at Central High School. Sophomore quarterback Jackson Burke was surgical once again, completing 21 of 23 passes for 440 yards and six touchdowns, distributing the ball across multiple targets in another balanced performance.

Playmakers shine on every series

Junior Gaines Howard led all receivers with eight receptions for 183 yards and a touchdown, while senior

Stone Perkins posted three catches for 153 yards and two scores, including strikes of 55 and 70 yards. Junior Ja'Hyde Brown added six receptions for 42 yards and two touchdowns, and senior Micah Akin capped a first-quarter drive with a short touchdown grab. On the ground, senior Tyree Stoner contributed 21 rushing yards and a touchdown, and senior Jeffrey Vazzana added 37 yards on limited carries.

Defensive consistency continues

CAL's defense held Central to 92 rushing yards and 0 passing completions,

recording another dominant outing. Senior Jackson Settle paced the defense with 12 total tackles, a tackle for loss, and a forced fumble. Sophomore Gabriel Lumpkin also forced a fumble, while junior Micah Newsome recovered one to stop a Central drive. Newsome and sophomore Kellan Hall each tallied seven tackles and multiple stops behind the line. Seniors Chapman Russell and Brody Cherry added tackles for loss, and senior Jason Hilliard contributed three tackles with a TFL as CAL's front seven controlled the line of scrimmage throughout.

Special teams flawless

Freshman Noah Gividen went 7-for-7 on PATs, and CAL's coverage teams were sharp throughout, keeping the Yellowjackets pinned deep and denying any return momentum.

Next step

The win moves CAL to 8–0 heading into Senior Night next Friday at home against Western High School. With three straight Class 3A state titles behind them and an offense averaging more than 45 points per game, the Centurions continue to look poised for another deep playoff run.

Varsity field hockey shows grit in loss to Assumption

The varsity field hockey team faced off against the Assumption Rockets on Friday night in a spirited varsity field hockey match-up. Despite the 3-0 final score in favor of Assumption, the Centurions showed resilience and determination against one of the area's top programs.

Assumption came out strong in the first quarter, capitalizing early with two quick goals – a bouncing ball that slipped through traffic and a cross that was deflected into the cage.

CAL's defense worked hard to settle in after those early strikes, with goalkeeper Morgan Lala standing tall and recording several clutch saves to keep the game within reach.

The Centurions generated offensive momentum in the second quarter, earning a penalty corner late in the half. Savannah Faulkner showcased her skill with a slick reverse shot that narrowly missed, deflecting just out of bounds.

The Centurions began finding more opportunities

in the circle. Still, Assumption added a third goal just before halftime to extend their lead.

Coming out of the break, CAL played with renewed energy and intensity. The team's second-half effort was marked by improved passing, better spacing, and a determined fight. Ella Hodge led the attack with two shots on goal, followed by Faulkner, Lindsey Sloan, and Therese Beiter, who each added one. Despite several promising circle penetrations and four penalty

corners, CAL couldn't find the back of the cage against the Rockets' defense.

Lala finished the night with an impressive 22 saves, keeping the Centurions competitive until the final whistle. While the scoreboard didn't reflect their effort, CAL's composure, teamwork, and hustle—especially from younger players stepping into key roles—were clear signs of progress. The Centurions will look to build on this performance as they prepare for their next match-up.

Varsity volleyball enters final week of regular season
