HS girls soccer reaches region finals

The high school girls soccer team's season came to an end with an 8-0 defeat to Sacred Heart in the 7th Region finals last Saturday at Ballard.

CAL contained a potent Valkyrie attack early and trailed just 2-0 at half-time, but a barrage of goals early in the second half proved to be too much.

The game marked the Centurions' first appearance in the region title game since 2013.

Earlier in the week, CAL earned two quality wins to earn its spot in the finals.

On Monday, CAL outlasted Male 3-2 in the quarterfinal round.

The game got off to a fast start, with CAL leading 2-1 15 minutes into the first half on a pair of goals by Blakely Touche.

Kaylee McClure extended the CAL lead to 3-1 with a goal early in the second half, and that score held until Male

struck back to get within a goal with 10 minutes to play.

The Centurion defensive back line held strong down the stretch, and CAL secured the win to advance to the next round.

CAL met Manual in the semifinals on Wednesday at Waggener.

The score remained tied at 0-0 deep into the second half of a defensive battle until Blakely Touche broke through with the score CAL had been searching for all night with three minutes to go.

Grace Hureau played a strong game in goal in conjunction with the defense to hold Manual scoreless for just the fifth time this season.

Following the championship game vs. Sacred Heart, Touche, McClure and Lydia Wallace were all named to the Seventh Region all-tournament tournament.

Varsity football blows out Western on senior night

Offense strikes early and often

Christian Academy of Louisville celebrated Senior Night in commanding fashion, defeating Western 61–0 to improve to 9–0.

Sophomore quarterback Jackson Burke was efficient as ever, completing 5 of 5 passes for 174 yards and three touchdowns before giving way to the backups. Freshman Will Seifert connected on his lone pass for 24 yards, and senior Tyree Stoner added a 14-yard completion on a designed play-action look.

Balanced scoring across the roster

CAL spread the produc-

tion throughout the lineup. Senior Jeffrey Vazzana (48 yards), junior Trevor McDill (29 yards), senior Tyree Stoner (25 yards), and sophomore Jayden Leak (21 yards) each scored rushing touchdowns.

Through the air, junior Ja'Hyde Brown (62 yards), junior Gaines Howard (39 yards), and senior Chapman Russell (1 yard) caught touchdown passes from Burke. Senior Micah Akin added a 42-yard reception, and sophomore Carson Hahn contributed a 24-yard grab.

Defense dominates every snap

Western managed only 24 total yards of offense and

two first downs.

Junior linebacker Micah Newsome led CAL with 8 tackles and a TFL. Senior Jackson Settle added 6 tackles and 2 TFLs, while sophomore Britt Dennison posted 5 tackles with 2 assists for loss. Senior Jason Hilliard tallied a sack, and sophomore Kellan Hall added a TFL. Junior Gaines Howard not only excelled offensively but also grabbed a 22-yard interception return, marking CAL's only takeaway of the night.

Special teams steady

Freshman Noah Gividen converted 6 of 7 PATs, while freshman Price Head added another.

CAL's kick coverage limited Western's field position all evening, and both Ja'Hyde Brown (39 yards) and Tyree Stoner (47 yards) logged punt-return touchdowns to cap a complete team performance.

Next step

The Centurions head into their bye week (Oct. 24) at 9–0 before closing the regular season on the road at Fern Creek on Oct. 31. With three straight Class 3A titles behind them and another shutout added to their résumé, CAL looks every bit prepared for another postseason run.
