Varsity field hockey wins region, advances to state finals

Varsity field hockey put together an impressive week to advance to the state finals for the first time since 2020.

Last Monday, the Centurions edged Sacred Heart in the Second Region finals for the second straight year by a final score of 3-2.

Lauren Sloan scored twice, and Madelyn Frazee a goal of her own. Megan Mauzy dished out a pair of assists, and Savannah Faulkner assisted on the third goal. Goalkeeper Morgan Lala recorded 15 assists and didn't allow a goal in the winning effort.

CAL hosted Collegiate for the second time in less than a week in the state quarterfinals on Thursday and rolled to a 4-0 win.

A slow start left the Centurions ahead just 1-0 at halftime on the back of an Aslin Bearance goal, but CAL turned on the jets in the second half to give itself breathing room.

Girls win, boys take second at region cross country meet Plummer wins for girls, Herbig second for boys

The boys and girls high school cross country teams had success at the 2A Third Region meet on Saturday, Oct. 21, at Seneca Park.

The girls won the team title by a wide margin with 23 points, half the total of second-place Shelby County.

Anabelle Plummer won the individual championship by nearly two minutes with a time of 19:30. Teammate Taylor Greenwell finished third with a time of

Varsity football routs E-Town on senior night

Varsity football celebrated its senior night* this past Friday night by delivering a resounding 55-7 victory against the Elizabethtown High School Panthers. Senior quarterback Cole Hodge completed 17-of-29 passes for 273 yards and four touchdowns.

Junior wideout Connor Hodge had eight receptions for 98 yards and one touchdown, senior wideout Justin Ruffin had six receptions for 68 yards and one touchdown, junior wideout Bryce Wilson had three receptions for 70 yards and one touchdown, and freshman tight end Micah Akin had one reception for a touchdown. Sophomore running back Jeffrey Vazzana led the Centurions on the ground, rushing for 99 yards and one touchdown on 10 carries. Quarterback Cole Hodge added two rushing touchdowns, running for 43 total yards on three carries.

Sophomore quarterback Colin Daniels played most of the second half, completing 6-of-10 passes for 103 yards and one touchdown.

The touchdown came after a deep 33-yard pass completion to senior tight end Cobe Ross that put the Centurions on the Panthers' 5-yard-line. On the next play, Daniels again connected with Ross, who carried it across the goal line for a touchdown.

Additionally, freshman wideout Ja'Hyde Brown had four receptions for 48 yards, and sophomore running back Mason Thomas rushed for 16 yards on three carries.

The Centurion defense shut out the Panthers' offense and held them to just 31 yards of total offense. The Panthers' only score came from their defense in the second quarter after an interception was returned for a touchdown.

Senior linebacker Connor Franklin led the defense with five tackles. Freshman Grayden Reid had four tackles, followed by senior defensive end Nathan Ehrenborg, sophomore linebacker Chapman Russell, and freshman linebacker Garyon Hobbs, who each recorded three tackles.

Senior defensive lineman Nathan Carlisle had one sack for a five-yard loss.

Freshman kicker Madden Miller was perfect on point after attempts, knocking in all seven tries.

The Centurions travel to Fern Creek Friday, Oct. 23, for the final regular season game 2023. Kickoff will be at 7:30 p.m.

MS football avenges 2022 playoff loss to Raceland

Going into its second round game vs Raceland, the middle school football team needed to answer a couple questions.

How would they handle assumed tougher opposition following a season of lopsided wins?

Was Raceland, which knocked them out in this same round last year, a bad match up?

CAL answered questions emphatically by blowing out the visiting Rams 46-6

3rd/4th football season ends in playoff semis

The CAL Pee Wee football team kicked off its first game of the LYFL playoffs looking to avenge a 20-15 regular season loss against the Hikes Point Lobos.

The Centurions opted to receive the kickoff and started off at midfield. During the first offensive play, CAL was bitten by the turnover bug, mishandling the ball and losing a fumble. The first Lobos drive was also a quick one. They couldn't move the chains and turned the ball over on downs.

The next CAL series saw the Centurions pick up a few downs, but the drive stalled after they fell short on a fourth and three for a turnover on downs.

Hikes Point took over on their own 35-yard line and were moving the ball convincingly until Gavin Ihnen came in from the corner position and recorded a sack for a loss of 15 yards. Then Hikes Point attempted a deep pass, and Preston Burge came down with an interception to put the brakes on the drive.

CAL had a short drive and were forced to punt, but the Lobos mishandled the punt and CAL recovered at midfield. CAL marched the ball down the field chunk gains on the ground by running Jack Lowe and quarterback Jake Blandford. With less than a minute left in the half, CAL reached the Lobos' 20-yard line but couldn't convert, turning the ball over on downs.

The Lobos broke off a long touchdown run on the final play of the first half, and CAL went into the break down 6-0.

Hikes Point started off the second half with the ball and hit a sneaky pass over the top of the defense on fourth down to go up 13-0. The next CAL drive ended with an interception that was returned to the CAL 20. The Lobos scored on the ensuing drive to go up 20-0. The next CAL drive was a short one, as Hikes Point recovered a Centurion fumble as time ran out on the third quarter.

The fourth quarter was a quick one, as CAL was not able to find the end zone and the Lobos tacked on one more score to go up 27-0, which was the final score. The loss was a tough one that brought the team's season to a close. However, the boys grew this fall and represented the school well.
