



Varsity football dominates Marion County Advances to second round of 3A playoffs

The Christian Academy of Louisville (CAL) Centurions delivered an overpowering performance against Marion County last Friday night in the first round of the Kentucky Class 3A Playoffs, cruising to a decisive 56-7 victory and demonstrating their championship potential.

Senior quarterback Connor Hodge led CAL's potent offense, completing 5-of-5 passes for 217 yards and four touchdowns. Hodge also showcased his mobility, adding a 39-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter. Freshman quarterback Jackson Burke stepped in seamlessly in the second half and completed 7-of-9 passes for 107 yards and two touchdowns, pro-

viding depth and control.

The Centurions' receiving corps had an impressive night. Senior wide receiver Trey Cotton caught three passes for 106 yards and three touchdowns, including a spectacular 49-yard touchdown reception that helped extend CAL's lead in the second quarter. Junior wide receiver Gaines Howard added two receptions for 92 yards, including a 58-yard touchdown in the first quarter, and junior Britt Redman capped off the scoring with a 20-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter.

On the ground, junior running back Jeffery Vazzana rushed for 19 yards on three carries, while junior Tyree

The team had an outstanding number of top 10 finishes in the meet.

Addie Eschenbach recorded a fabulous second place finish in the 50 yard back and finished fourth in the 50 yard free. Max Tatchell had a marvelous second place effort in 50 yard breaststroke and took sixth in 100 individual medley. Jack Cunningham powered his way to a second place finish in the 50-yard free and placed ninth in the 100 yard in the individual medley.

Emma Janes had an impressive fifth place finish in the 50 yard free and placed eighth in the 50 yard backstroke.

Sky Pruett had a powerful finish in the 50 free & in the 100 IM. Adelynn Craft also notched a top 20 finish in the 50 yard back.

The CAL's girls relay of Adelyn Craft, Emma Janes, Addie Echenbach and Sky Pruett had its best finish this season with a strong fourth place in the 200-yard medley relay and a seventh place mark in the 200-yard free relay.

The boys relay of Quil Ritz, Max Tatchell, Jack Cunningham

and Jackson Kelly also had its best finish this season, taking ninth in the medley relay and 10th in the 200 free relay.

Kimber Davis, Lucy Norton, Kaylee Montgomery and Leelah Sturgeon also had a top twenty finish in the 200 yard free relay.

Stoner contributed a 7-yard rushing touchdown, further showcasing CAL's balanced offensive attack.

CAL's defense was relentless, holding Marion County to just 132 total yards. Sophomore linebacker Micah Newsome led the team with 10 total tackles, making his presence felt across the field. Junior linebacker Jackson Settle contributed 9 tackles, while junior defensive lineman Jason Hilliard recorded 8 tackles, including an assisted sack. Junior linebacker Chapman Russell, sophomore linebacker Garyon Hobbs, and freshman defensive lineman Kellan Hall each added 7 tackles, with Russell recording both a solo and an assisted sack along with a

forced fumble, and Hobbs also securing a solo sack to disrupt Marion County's offensive efforts.

CAL's aggressive defense forced multiple turnovers, including a fumble recovery by Newsome in the third quarter that helped maintain the Centurions' momentum.

With the victory, CAL advances in their championship pursuit and moves on to the next round of the Class 3A playoffs. This Friday, the Centurions will travel to Harrodsburg, KY, to face the 7-4 Mercer County Titans on the road. Be sure to follow and support the Centurions as they take on their next opponent in what promises to be another thrilling playoff matchup.

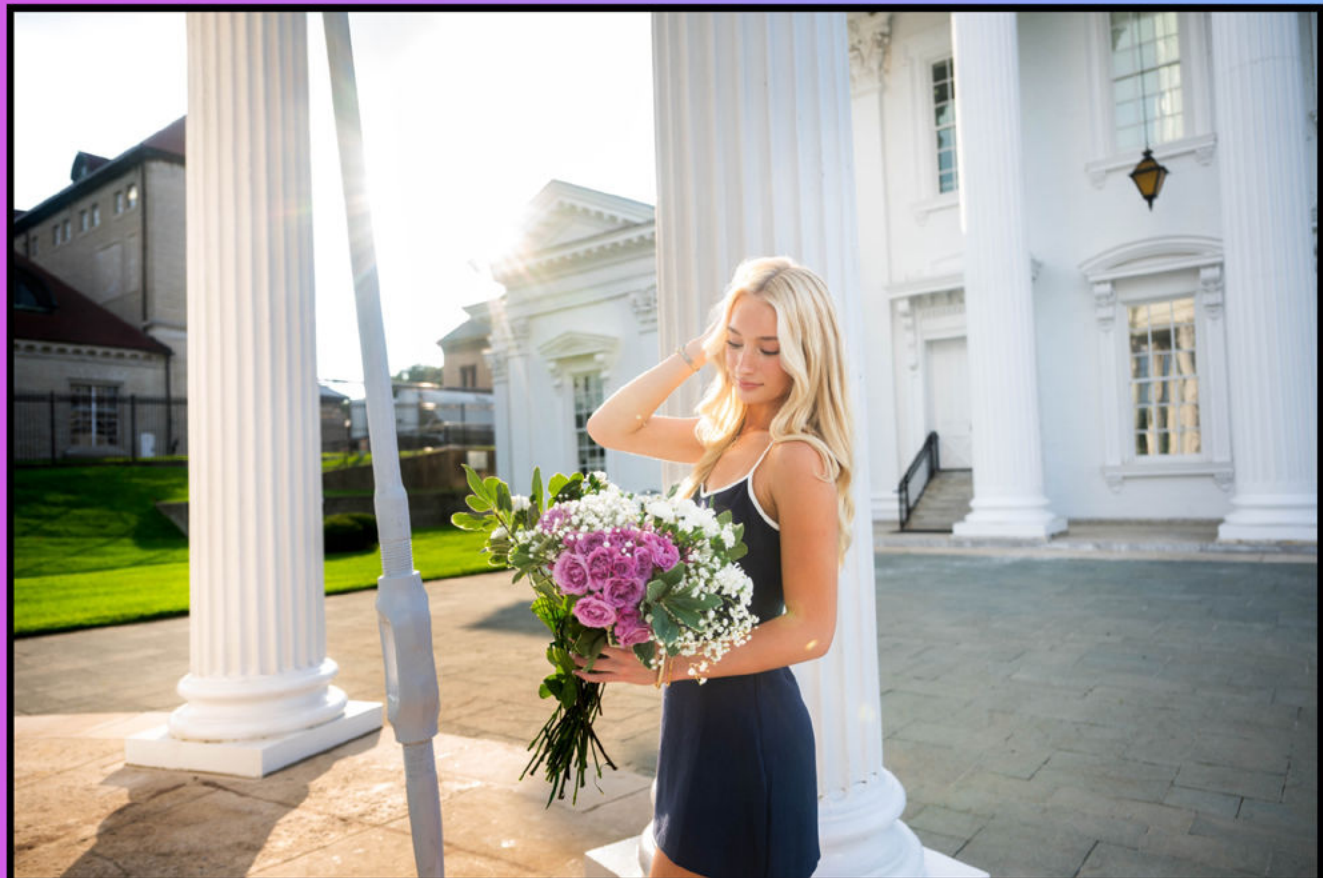
