Varsity football rolls at Mercer County Sets up region final match against Central

The varsity football team showcased its dominance with a 49-22 victory at Mercer County in the second round of the 3A playoffs on Friday night.

The win propels the Centurions to the regional championship and brings them one step closer to a third straight state title.

Offensive Highlights

Senior quarterback Connor Hodge delivered an exceptional performance, totaling 429 yards of offense. Hodge completed 21-of-30 passes for 320 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for 109 yards and three touchdowns on just eight carries. His 48-yard touchdown run in the first quarter set the tone for CAL's offensive explosion.

Junior running back Tyree Stoner made a significant contribution on the ground, rushing for 91 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries, including a highlight-reel 46-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

Senior wide receiver Trey Cotton led the receiving corps with six catches for 126 yards, including a pivotal 62-yard reception that set up a touchdown. Junior wide receiver Stone Perkins added three receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns, including an 84-yard score. Sophomore Ja'Hyde Brown and senior Bryce Wilson each chipped

in with critical receptions, with Brown hauling in a one-yard touchdown grab.

Defensive Standouts

CAL's defense was relentless, holding Mercer County to 292 total yards. Sophomore linebacker Micah Newsome led the way with eight tackles, including two tackles for loss. Freshman Kellan Hall continued his impressive postseason with seven tackles, while junior linebacker Chapman Russell added six tackles and a solo sack. Sophomore Garyon Hobbs contributed four tackles and a clutch interception that helped seal the game.

Special Teams

Sophomore kicker Madden Miller was flawless, converting all seven of his extra-point attempts and consistently limiting Mercer County's return game with well-placed kickoffs.

Looking Ahead

With the win, CAL advances to host Central in the regional championship this Friday, Nov. 22 at 7:30 p.m.

This game is a rematch of a regular-season meeting last month, which the Yellow Jackets won. With redemption on the line, the Centurions will aim to secure their spot in the state semifinals. Be sure to come out and support CAL in this crucial playoff matchup!
