Thirteen teams competed across three divisions in the inaugural Rhonda Hoyer Tournament, held in honor of the former CAL coach who passed away last year.

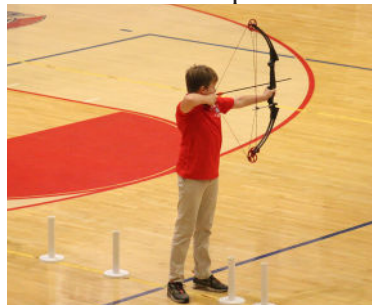
The Centurions placed fourth out of seven teams in the high school division with a team score of 2969. Jaden Blanford paced the Centurions with a team score of 268, good for 10th place. Jackson Meek, Gabe Fletcher and Maeleigh Randolph

shot 260, 259 and 257, respectively, for CAL.

The middle school team finished fifth in its division with a team score of 2331. Gavin Boyd had an outstanding day for CAL, finishing tied for the top score in the middle school division at 269. Charlie Rix finished in sixth place with a score of 249.

on Dec. 6 in the Festival of Flights tournament at Mid-America Sports Center.

Varsity football rolls past Union Co. in state quarterfinals

Christian Academy of Louisville continued its playoff dominance Friday night, defeating Union County 48-7 at home to advance to the Class 3A semifinals.

Offense efficient, balanced, and unrelenting

Sophomore quarterback Jackson Burke was perfect through the air, completing 10 of 10 passes for 157 yards and three touchdowns.

Senior Jeffrey Vazzana powered the run game with six carries for 101 yards and two touchdowns, averaging nearly 17 yards per attempt. Senior Tyree Stoner added

two carries and a receiving touchdown, while juniors Ja'Hyde Brown, Gaines Howard, and Andrew Greene combined for all three receiving scores—Brown leading the way with seven catches for 102 yards and a touchdown.

Defense suffocates again

CAL's defense held Union County to just 44 rushing yards and 80 passing yards, allowing one late score after the outcome was well in hand.

Senior Chapman Russell and junior Micah Newsome led with 13 tackles each. Newsome added a TFL and

a sack, while Russell posted 2 tackles for loss and a sack. Senior Jackson Settle was all over the field, logging 12 tackles, and sophomore Kellan Hall added 12 tackles and a tackle for loss. Senior Jason Hilliard added 7 tackles, 3 TFLs, and 2 sacks, with seniors Brody Cherry and Eric Jones and sophomore Gabriel Lumpkin contributing additional tackles for loss and stops in space.

Senior Stone Perkins delivered a standout night: 7 tackles, a 36-yard fumble return for a touchdown, and a 44-yard interception return

for another score. Junior Jayson Ruffin added two interceptions for 21 return yards as CAL finished with three picks on the night.

Special teams steady Junior Madden Miller remained perfect on the season, converting 6-of-6 PATs to cap another complete effort.

Next step

Sitting at 12-0 and chasing a fourth straight state championship, the Centurions advance to the Class 3A semifinals, hosting Bell County this Friday, November 28, at 7:00 p.m.
