



Varsity football overcomes Central in region finals Will play Lexington Catholic in state semifinals

In an intense rematch, the CAL varsity football team claimed a regional championship with a decisive 28-6 victory over the Central Yellowjackets last Friday.

This win propels CAL into the 3A state semifinals, keeping their aspirations of a third state state championship alive.

Offensive Highlights

Senior quarterback Connor Hodge showcased his versatility once again, throwing for 209 yards on 11-of-22 passing, including two touchdown

passes, and adding two rushing touchdowns for a total of 159 rushing yards on 18 carries. His 48-yard run in the fourth quarter secured the Centurions' victory.

Senior wide receiver Trey Cotton was a key target for Hodge, recording three receptions for 81 yards and a 25-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Sophomore Garyon Hobbs also contributed two catches for 29 yards, including a 2-yard touchdown reception that opened the scoring for CAL. Sophomore Ja'Hyde Brown

added three receptions for 42 yards, including a 33-yard catch that set up a touchdown.

Defensive Standouts

The CAL defense delivered a dominant performance, holding Central to just 167 total yards while forcing two interceptions.

Sophomore linebacker Micah Newsome led the charge with 13 total tackles, including a tackle for loss. Sophomore linebacker Garyon Hobbs contributed 12 tackles, and senior defensive back Trey Cotton added 10 tackles, anchoring the secondary with key stops.

Senior safety Connor Hodge was a game-changer on defense, recording two interceptions and making a critical touchdown-saving tackle that kept Central off the scoreboard in a pivotal moment.

Junior defensive lineman Jason Hilliard made a significant impact with six tackles, a solo sack, and a forced fumble.

The HS bowling team took the lanes twice last week.

The Centurion bowlers bounced back to secure a dominant 9-0 victory against Atherton on Thursday night. The match was competitive early on, with the Ravens putting up a fight in the preliminary games, but the Centurions found their rhythm and finished strong to earn a sweep of their opponents.

Senior Nick Bischoff once again led the team, posting an impressive high

score of 175. Jackson Nguyen followed closely with a solid 166, while Nick Barnett showcased his skill with a strong 149. Freshman Ethan Hall contributed with a 146, and newcomer Charlie Behnken had his best performance of the season with a 133.

CAL will take a well-deserved break for Thanksgiving before returning to action against Walden on Dec. 3 at Ten Pin Lanes.
