#### Varsity football completes undefeated regular season

#### Fast start on the road

Christian Academy of Louisville closed the regular season 10-0 with a 42-7 win at Fern Creek. Sophomore quarterback Jackson Burke was sharp again, completing 18-of-23 passes for 210 yards and four touchdowns, steering an offense that never lost rhythm.

#### Balanced attack fuels 10–0 finish

Junior Ja'Hyde Brown led all receivers with seven catches for 118 yards and three touchdowns. Senior Tyree Stoner added six carries for 52 yards and two scores on the ground plus four receptions for 39 yards and a touchdown through the air. Senior Jeffrey Vazzana provided balance with nine carries for 46 yards, while senior Micah Akin (19 yards) and juniors Gaines Howard and Jayden Leak (17 yards each) moved the chains through the air.

#### Defensive pressure and takeaways

CAL held Fern Creek to 114 total yards and five first downs. Junior Micah Newsome, sophomore Kellan Hall, and senior Chapman Russell each recorded sacks. Russell also made a key pass deflection that junior Gaines Howard grabbed for a pick. Senior Eric Jones added a second interception to snuff out Fern Creek's momentum. Seniors Jackson Settle and Brody Cherry chipped in tackles for loss, and sophomore Gabriel Lumpkin disrupted plays behind the line.

#### Special teams solid once more

Freshman Noah Gividen was perfect on extra points

(6-for-6) and averaged roughly 54 yards per kick-off. Brown added a 14-yard punt return, and coverage units kept Fern Creek's field position in check.

#### Next step

With the 10–0 finish, CAL opens the Class 3A UK HealthCare State Playoffs at home against Mercer County on Friday, November 7, at 7:30 p.m. With three straight state titles and a balanced roster, the Centurions enter the postseason with momentum and depth across all three phases.

# Varsity field hockey finishes as state runner up



The varsity field hockey team fell just one game shy of its second state championship in three years, falling 3-1 against top-ranked Sacred Heart in the finals on Wednesday.

The Valkyries scored three second quarter goals, and a strong second half push from the Centurions was not enough to close the gap. Amelia Ohr scored the lone goal of the second half for either team.

Earlier in the week, the Centurions defeated Manual and Ballard in the quarterfinals and semifinals, respectively, to reach the championship match.

Following the tour-

nament, CAL's Morgan Lala, Savannah Faulkner and Ella Hodge were named to the all-state tournament team. CAL finished the year with a 15-9-2 record.

The high school boys and girls cross country teams had a strong showing at the KHSAA 2A state meet last weekend in Lexington.

The girls qualified as a team and finished in 18th place with a total of 458 points.

Senior Anabelle Plummer finished an illustrious career with an 11th place finish and a time of 20:02.69. She leaves CAL with the third fastest time in program history, set at last year's state meet.

Behind Plummer was Kinsley Cordrey in 69th place, Reese Fletch in 125th place, Jillian Besore in 164th place and Lydia Griffiths in 167th place.

The boys team sent three individual qualifiers to the meet.

Jackson Fitzgerald paced CAL with a 150th place finish, followed by Charlie Behnken in 171st place and Elijah Nelson in 174th place.

#### **Schoenbeck named ACC field hockey** offensive player of the year

CAL field hockey alumnus Mia Schoenbeck was named the ACC's offensive player of the year this week.

Schoenbeck, a junior

Touche was joined by Kaylee Mc-Clure on the 7th region 1st team.


