Varsity football cruises to first round playoff win

On Friday night, varsity kicked off postseason play with an outstanding 61-13 victory against the Marion County High School Knights.

Dominating from the jump, CAL built a 35-0 advantage by the end of the first quarter. A quick score in the opening minute of the second quarter extended its lead to 42-0, invoking a running clock for the rest of the game.

Senior quarterback Cole Hodge displayed a flawless passing performance in the first half, completing all eight attempts for 301 yards and five touchdowns.

Junior wideout Connor Hodge caught three of these touchdowns. Connor's remarkable first half performance extended to the defensive side of the ball as well. He intercepted a pass and returned it from the 25-yard line for a fourth touchdown.

Senior wideout Justin Ruffin also stood out with three catches, including two touchdowns.

Sophomore running back Jeffrey Vazzana also powered through for a touchdown on three carries.

Three individuals earn KTCCCA all-area honors

Three members of the high school cross country team were honored by the Kentucky Track and Cross Country Coaches Association following the conclusion of the 2023 season.

Junior Sam Herbig and sophomore Annabelle Plummer were named the 2A Region Three runners of the year.

Additionally, firstyear head coach Daria Ochenkowski was named the region's boys and girls coach of the year. The efforts of the three award recipients helped CAL to a strong campaign.

The girls team finished ninth in the 2A state championship, led by a fifth place finish by Plummer. The boys team took 25th behind a sixth place finish by Herbig.

The Centurions graduate no seniors from a young roster that improved dramatically throughout the fall under Ochenkowski's guidance.

MS football rolls past Breathitt Co. in state semis Will face Owensboro Catholic in championship

Middle school football continued its crash course to the state championship game with another dominant performance, defeating Breathitt County 44-6 on Saturday at Shelby County High School.

The Centurions were superior on both sides of the line scrimmage all night.

The defense held the Bobcats to 51 total yards, with the majority of the yardage coming on a late 29-yard touchdown when the game was well out of reach at 44-0.

Like most games this year, the CAL offense hit the ground running. Gabe Lumpkin ran it in from 53 yards out on the game's second play. A Noah Perkins

reception on the PAT gave CAL an early 8-0 lead.

The second quarter was ultimately the period that put the game away, as CAL outscored Breathitt County 30-0.

The Centurions generated multiple explosive plays through the running game during the quarter. Noah Perkins ran it in from 40 yards out and Lumpkin again scored the second of his three touchdowns on a 64-yard scamper.

This seemed to be a product of the Bobcats' focus on taking away the Centurions vaunted passing attack, as CAL proved that they are far from one dimensional.

Lumpkin went over the century mark for the second straight week with

134 rushing yards, and Perkins finished with 56 yards on the ground.

With the win, CAL advances to the state championship game, where it will meet Owensboro Catholic, which defeated Hazard 6-0 in its semifinal matchup.

The game will be played at 3 p.m. this Saturday at Lexington Christian Academy.

CAL will look to finish off what has been a thoroughly dominant season. The Centurions have won every game this season by at least 30 points and scored at least 38 points in each contest.

Varsity volleyball coach Sherry Ashley was named the Seventh Region coach of the year by the Kentucky Volleyball Coaches Association last week.

CAL has amassed a 64-30 record under Ashley and has reached the Seventh Region quarterfinals in each year of her tenure.

Sophomore quarterback Colin Daniels entered the game in the second quarter and made his mark, completing 4-of-5 passes for 34 yards and a touchdown. The score came on a precision play where Daniels connected with sophomore tight end Micah Aiken in the end zone on a deep drop back from

the 12-yard-line.

The Centurion defense maintained their impressive form, limiting the Knights to just 34 yards of total offense in the first quarter.

As the game progressed and younger defensive players gained invaluable experience, several players had standout performances.

Freshman linebacker Micah Newsome led the defense with eight tackles, followed closely by freshman defensive back Grayden Reid with seven tackles and sophomore linebacker Mason Thomas with five tackles.

Sophomore defensive back Andrew Green gave the defense its second score of

the night when he intercepted a pass on the 44-yard line and ran it back for a pick-six.

The Centurions are poised to continue their postseason journey this Friday night, Nov. 10, when they host Elizabethtown at 7:30 p.m. The two teams met on Oct. 20, with CAL prevailing 55-7.
