Varsity boys basketball rolls past South Oldham

Varsity boys basketball erupted offensively in an 89-65 win at South Oldham last Tuesday.

The Centurions mounted a 44-37 lead by halftime, then pulled away in the final two quarters to leave Crestwood with a victory.

Senior BB Washington continued his strong start to the season with his second straight 30-point effort. The Florida Gulf Coast commit has scored at least 25 points in five of the Centurions' first six games to lead the team with a 24.8 points per game average.

Junior Connor Hodge and senior Nolan Wahl also made significant offensive impacts on Thursday, recording 17 and 16 points, respectively. With the victory, CAL improved to 4-2 on the year. Both losses have come by one point each.

The Centurions host Seneca on Tuesday before traveling to South Laurel to play in the Nissan Dribble Drive Classive from Wednesday to Friday. CAL's first game of the tournament against Mason County is set to tipoff at 9 p.m. on Wednesday evening.

Sophomore Anabelle Plummer continued a strong fall with CAL into earning All-American honors at the US-ATF Junior Olympic cross country meet two weekends ago at EP Tom Sawyer State Park.

Plummer finished 18th in the 15- and 16-year-old division with a time of 19:55. The top 25 times were recognized as All-Americans. Her team, Thom-

Varsity girls basketball splits two

The varsity girls basketball team held serve last week, splitting a pair of contests against Frankfort and Whitefield Academy.

The Centurions started the week on a high note with a 57-33 win over visiting Frankfort on Tuesday.

CAL closed the first quarter on an 8-1 run to take a 15-7 lead at the end of the period.

The Centurion advantage ballooned out to double digits late in the second quarter, but the Panthers closed the half with an 8-0 spurt to inch back within four at 25-21 going into the locker room.

CAL regained control in the third quarter and stretched its lead out to 43-28 at the end of the third quarter before padding it further in the fourth.

Sophomore Brianna Wilkins shot an efficient 9-for-13 inside the arc to score a game-high 26 points.

Bailee Duck keyed the offense with 17 points from the point guard position.

CAL overcame a poor shoot-
