Varsity girls basketball showing growth early

The varsity girls basketball season is well underway, with CAL holding a 2-8 record going into the new year.

The Centurions began the 2024-25 campaign with a pair of wins over Fern Creek (60-27) and Shawnee (74-52).

Since then, the team has faced a bevy of tough competition and dropped eight straight contests. The closest matchups came in a 45-42 defeat at Seneca and a 10-point loss at Lexington Catholic in the White, Greer and Maggard Classic.

A number of players have stood out on a Centurion squad that only features one upperclassman.

Freshman Candice Smith leads

the team in scoring with 10 points per game on 48.4% shooting from the field. Seventh grader Kathryn Cline (6.4 PPG), senior Katie Hendricks (6.2 PPG, 1.4 3-pointers per game) and sophomore Lydia Wallace (5.4 PPG) have also provided significant offensive contributions.

Wallace has led the team in rebounding, hauling in 3.7 boards per contest. Smith (3.1 RPG) and freshman Abigail Bassett (2.7 RPG) have also been effective on the glass for CAL.

The Centurions start the 2025 calendar year with a pair of home games against Central on Jan. 3 and Lexington Christian on Jan. 4.

Last weekend, the team traveled to Nashville, TN to play in a tournament at Montgomery Bell County. CAL dropped a trio of games there to out-of-state teams

CAL will look to regroup after the New Year when it hosts Lexington Christian on Jan. 4 at 7:30 p.m.


