Varsity boys basketball splits two games

The varsity boys basketball team split a pair of games last week to move to 17-6 in the latter stages of the regular season.

On Tuesday, the Centurions suffered their first district loss of the season 77-66 at Ballard.

The game was competitive early, with the teams deadlocked at 16-all at the end of the first quarter.

Ballard connected on a buzzer beating 3 to take a 36-30 lead into halftime, its largest

advantage of the night at the time.

CAL held serve in the third quarter and trailed 50-44 going into the final period.

The Centurions got within a bucket multiple times in the fourth quarter, but Ballard held off a comeback attempt to put itself in the driver's seat for the top seed in this month's 28th District tournament.

Four Centurions finished with at least 11 points, led by Boogie Cook with 18.

On Friday, CAL bounced back to rout Collins 75-45 on the road.

JJ Washington had an outstanding day, scoring 25 points on 11-of-15 shooting to lead the Centurions. Roland Swan and Myles Howard added 12 and 11 points, respectively.

This week, CAL travels to Oldham County on Monday and St. Xavier on Tuesday before hosting Eastern on Friday.
