



Varsity football blows out defending 5A state champs

The senior class called for a RED HOT Red Out for Friday's varsity football game against defending KY 5A State Champions Owensboro. The Centurions answered by setting the scoreboard on fire while keeping the Red Devils off of it! With Owensboro rolling in off a big W against 6A powerhouse St. Xavier the week before, some might have thought the Red Devils were going to be a problem for the Centurions. But CAL extinguished any hopes of an Owensboro win from the very beginning, shutting out the Red Devils 52-0 in front of a fired up home crowd!

ON FIRE FROM KICKOFF

For the Red Devils, the opening kickoff was a foreshadowing of things to come. Senior Captain Ja'Hyde Brown and Junior Jayden Leak were back deep to return for CAL. Owensboro might have thought they were kicking to the lesser threat by kicking to the junior receiver, but Leak very quickly proved that was not the case. Leak left a streak of fire down the field as he exploded with a 70 yard kickoff return and ignited the crowd of Centurion Faithful into an eruption of cheers. **YOU GET A TD, YOU GET A TD, YOU GET A TD**

Junior captain QB Jackson Burke was handing out touchdown passes like Oprah hands out cars to her audience. Six different Centurions found themselves in the endzone holding onto at least one (if not a couple) of Burke's cannons. Burke passed for 256 yards with a 93% completion rate on the night.

The first touchdown of the night came a little less than three minutes into the game when Burke found

Junior Noah Perkins wide open in the endzone. Everyone, including several cameramen, thought Burke had handed the ball off. While the Red Devils' defenders chased the run down, Perkins was wide open and all alone in the endzone waiting to receive his first touchdown of the season.

Burke went on to "pass out" touchdowns to five other Centurions. Senior captain Ja'Hyde Brown continued to find the endzone with two touchdowns and 92 total yards against the Red Devils. Senior Andrew Greene found the endzone for the second game in a row; adding 76 yards to the Centurions' total 272. Senior Garyon Hobbs and Junior Jayden Leak also landed in the endzone with one of Burke's passes.

Senior captain Micah Newsome proved he's not only a powerhouse on the defensive side of the ball Friday night with his first TD catch of the season. Late in the first quarter with the Centurions back in the red zone, Newsome found himself behind the defense in the endzone and on the receiving side of a short pass from Burke to put CAL up 21-0 with a minute left in the first quarter.

TRIPLE THREAT

CAL kickers showed up and out Friday night as they went 7 for 7 on extra points with eight of their kickoffs ending up in the endzone for touchbacks! Senior Madden Miller went 3 for 3, Sophomore Noah Gividen went 3 for 3 and Sophomore Price Head went 1 for 1 on their extra point kicks.

Gividen showed off his leg by drilling a 42-yard field goal and sending all five of his kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks. Miller added three

The fifth play of the game saw Senior Jason Ruffin read the Red Devils' play perfectly - stepping in front of Owensboro's receiver to intercept the ball. Ruffin's pick gave the ball right back to CAL, putting them in perfect scoring position on their own 21 yard line.

In the same quarter, Junior Kellan Hall found a hole the size of Texas in the Red Devils' O-line and made the quarterback pay the price. Hall charged through the line untouched and brought the Red Devils' quarterback down hard. A collective "ohh-hhh" from both sidelines could be heard from the stands.

Before the Red Devils could rest at halftime another Centurion powerhouse came barreling through the line to sack the quarterback. Junior Britt Dennison seemed to slip right through the o-line undetected to wrap up Owensboro's quarterback for a second time in the first half. Halftime couldn't

have come soon enough for the visiting Red Devils.

The Centurion defense held the defending KY 5A State Champs to just 42 total yards on the night and a donut on the scoreboard. CAL brought a stop to Owensboro's 14 game winning streak Friday night in front of a fired up horde of Centurion Faithful.

Varsity girls soccer falls in 2A Sectional

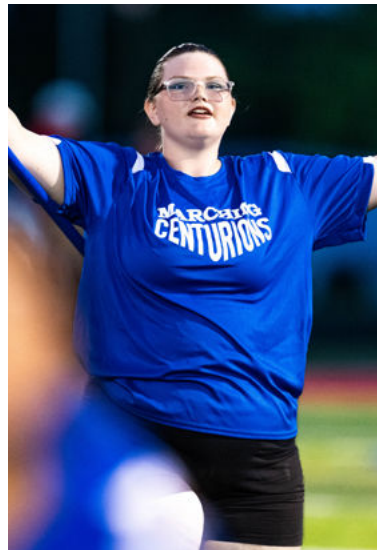
The varsity girls soccer team started strong but couldn't hang in a 4-1 loss to North Oldham in the 2A Section 3 tournament last Monday.

JV field hockey wins nailbiter over Sacred Heart

The CAL JV field hockey team traveled to Sacred Heart on Thursday night for a highly anticipated clash between two premier programs. In a tightly contested battle from start to finish, CAL's defense and late-game offensive pressure delivered a thrilling 1-0 victory.

First Quarter

The opening quarter featured back-and-forth action, with neither team able to break through. CAL created a promising corner opportunity when Kylie Arthurs' shot on goal narrowly missed the mark. Defensively, Catherine Taber was rock solid in goal, recording two important stops while working behind a CAL defense led by Clara Henderson, Therese Beiter and Emberlyn Fitzgerald. After 15 minutes, the game remained scoreless.

Second Quarter

CAL continued to battle in the second quarter with Skylar Akin, Alli Cherry, Maddie Day and Lena Stucker controlling the middle of the field, creating a Macie Mauzy shot on goal that missed wide. However, Sacred Heart answered with a sideline run that resulted in a clean look, but Catherine Taber came up with another outstanding play, making a beautiful kick save to keep the game tied. At halftime, the

scoreboard still read 0-0.

Third Quarter

CAL came out of halftime with renewed energy, applying offensive pressure only to have its attack stymied by Sacred Heart star goalie Ella Nelson. Sacred Heart answered with a corner of their own, but CAL's disciplined defense successfully fended off the attack. With three quarters complete, neither team had found the back of the net.

Fourth Quarter

With the game still knotted at 0-0, CAL looked to turn up the pressure. Kylie Arthurs produced a corner off a pass from Maddie Day, setting the stage for CAL's breakthrough... At the 7:34 mark, Emberlyn Fitzgerald inserted the corner to Macie Mauzy, who quickly passed to Kylie Arthurs. Kylie fired a shot on goal, and Emberlyn followed the play perfectly, stepping back in to collect the rebound and bury the go-ahead goal. CAL 1, Sacred Heart 0.

The final three minutes became a defensive battle as Sacred Heart pushed for the equalizer. CAL's back line stood tall, with Catherine Taber delivering clutch saves to preserve the lead. When the final whistle sounded, CAL had secured a hard-fought 1-0 victory over one of the state's premier

teams. It was a complete team effort — strong midfield play, meticulous offensive pressure, a determined defensive unit and outstanding goalkeeping when it mattered most.

5th/6th football beats J-Town

The Christian Academy of Louisville Juniors turned in a complete performance against the J-Town Bulldogs, combining explosive plays on offense with a defense that repeatedly came up with stops and turnovers on the way to a 26-8 Centurions victory.

CAL kicked off to begin the game, and Bryson Hamilton immediately set the tone with a tackle on the return. J-Town managed to move the chains early behind a strong rushing attack, but the Centurions refused to break. Hamilton piled up multiple tackles on the opening possession, while Johnny Newsome and Aiden Cox also came up with stops.

With the Bulldogs facing third-and-six, Preston Burge knifed into the backfield for a loss to set up fourth-and-nine. Burge came up big again on fourth down, making the tackle and turning the ball over to the CAL offense.

After a Burge run picked up three yards, the Centurions struck.

On third down, quarterback Miles Johnston dropped back behind excellent protection from his offensive line. With time to throw, Johnston launched a pass down the left side to Carter Lee, who went up between two Bulldog defenders, secured the catch and raced the rest of the way for a spectacular 70-yard touchdown.

The extra point was unsuccessful, but CAL had the early 6-0 lead.

The Centurion defense quickly went back to work. Gavin Ihnen made the first-

down tackle, followed by Avery Denton on second down. On third down, Hamilton and Alex Edison combined for a tackle for loss to set up fourth-and-nine. Jude Warren met the runner on fourth down, with a host of Centurions arriving to finish the stop and force another turnover on downs.

CAL needed only one play to capitalize.

Edison took the handoff to the left, found daylight and exploded 50 yards for a touchdown. Johnston kept the ball for the extra point, giving the Centurions a 13-0 advantage.

The momentum continued on the ensuing kickoff when J-Town put the ball on the ground and Edison recovered the fumble for CAL.

Penalties made the next Centurion possession difficult, but CAL found answers when it needed them. Facing fourth-and-nine, Johnston connected with Hamilton in the flat for a first down. Later, Johnston found Ihnen on third down to move the chains again. The drive eventually stalled, giving J-Town one final opportunity before halftime.

Tristan Ball made a first-down tackle as the Bulldogs mounted their best drive of the half. J-Town moved as far as the CAL 30-yard line before time expired, sending the Centurions into halftime with a 13-0 lead.

CAL received the second-half kickoff but soon found itself facing third-and-20. Johnston connected with Edison for 15 yards, but J-Town stopped the Centurions on fourth-and-five

and took over near midfield. Once again, the CAL defense responded.

Newsome made a tackle on the opening run, Hamilton added another stop and Ihnen got into the action. On third down, J-Town fumbled, and Avery Denton recovered it for the Centurions.

CAL immediately turned the takeaway into points.

Johnston hit Hamilton for a 30-yard gain on first down and went right back to him for another completion that moved the ball inside the 10.

Johnston then kept the ball around the right side, raced toward the goal line and stretched the football across for the touchdown. His extra-point pass to Ihnen was good, pushing CAL's lead to 20-0.

J-Town's next possession turned into the Leo "Bronco" Balsley show.

Balsley made a tackle on first down, and after another stop from Ihnen, Balsley came up with another tackle — and then another. Emmett Leffler added a third-down stop as the Bulldogs continued battling down the field. Balsley added yet another tackle later in the drive, while Turner Hernandez also got into the action.

Near the goal line, Brooks made an excellent pass breakup to prevent what nearly became a touchdown. J-Town eventually found the end zone and converted a kicked extra point, worth two points in league play, cutting the CAL advantage to 20-8 with four minutes remaining.

The Bulldogs attempted an onside kick, but Mac

Manley calmly fielded it to give CAL possession.

The Centurions then delivered the knockout blow. On third down, Johnston rolled to his right, stepped up in the pocket and fired a strike to Aiden Brooks, who took the ball all the way down to the 1-yard line. On the next play, Manley powered it across the goal line for the touchdown, extending the lead to 26-8 with 1:39 remaining.

J-Town had one final possession, but the CAL defense finished the game just as it had started it. Hernandez made a tackle, Balsley forced a runner out of bounds, and Josh Robinson came up with back-to-back tackles before Ihnen added another stop.

On the final play, J-Town took one last shot at the end zone.

John Beau Morrison was waiting.

Morrison intercepted the pass in the end zone to put the finishing touch on a dominant Centurion performance and seal the 26-8 CAL victory.

The Centurions received contributions from all over the field — explosive touchdowns from Lee and Edison, Johnston making plays through the air and on the ground, Hamilton producing on both sides of the ball, three forced turnovers, and a defense that repeatedly rose to the occasion on fourth down.

3rd/4th football cruises past J-Town

The Christian Academy of Louisville Peewees delivered a strong all-around performance against the J-Town Bulldogs at Sky View Park, combining explosive plays on offense with relentless defense to earn a 28-12 victory.

CAL struck first on the opening play of the game. Christian Sheehan took the opening play the distance and started the scoring for the game. The extra point was unsuccessful, but the Centurions quickly took a 6-0 lead.

The CAL defense answered with a strong opening stand. Miles Happel and Sheehan made tackles before McKinney recorded a tackle for loss on second down. Cooper Happel added another stop, and McKinney came up with a second tackle for loss to force a turnover on downs.

The Centurions capitalized immediately. Ryan Clark picked up eight yards, and on third down, Sheehan broke free for a 50-yard touchdown run, his second score of the game. Sheehan then connected with Colt Bindner on the two-point conversion, giving CAL a

14-0 advantage.

Silas McReynolds followed with a beautiful kickoff, and Paxton Satterwhite made the tackle on the return.

J-Town faced pressure on its next possession when big Luke Thayer came up the middle on first down. Cooper Happel and Miles Happel combined for a second-down tackle, and Cooper Happel added a tackle for loss. Weston Woodall then made a tackle for loss to force another turnover on downs.

CAL quickly extended its lead. A swing pass to Clark went for 15 yards on first down, and Madden Johnston took a motion handoff around the right side and raced 25 yards for a touchdown. The point-after attempt was unsuccessful, but the Centurions led 20-0 with 3:56 remaining in the half. The defense continued to make plays. Miles Happel recorded a sack, and Sheehan added another tackle. After a J-Town punt, Clark returned the ball to the 10-yard line.

On the next play, McKinney delivered a strike on a slant to Sheehan, who

scored his third touchdown of the day. McKinney then completed the two-point conversion to Leyton Howard, pushing CAL's lead to 28-0 with 1:53 left before halftime.

The Bulldogs answered with a scoring drive before the break, but Graham Miller made a tackle during the possession, and Jack Dudgeon stopped the extra-point attempt. CAL took a 28-6 lead into halftime.

Madden Johnston made the tackle on the second-half kickoff, and the Centurion defense continued to battle. Dudgeon, Finn Denton, Miller, Griff Middleton and Kieran O'Reilly all recorded tackles during the Bulldogs' next possession.

J-Town completed a big fourth-down pass down to the 1-yard line, but excellent pursuit from Middleton and a touchdown-saving tackle by Denton kept the Bulldogs out of the end zone temporarily. J-Town eventually punched it in at the end of the third quarter, cutting the lead to 28-12. The running clock remained in effect.

The Bulldogs recovered the ensuing onside kick, bringing the CAL defense

back onto the field. Cooper Happel made a first-down tackle, and Christian Sheehan stopped a second-down play for a loss. On third down, Graham Miller intercepted a pass to give the Centurions possession with five minutes remaining.

CAL moved the ball behind an eight-yard carry from Tyson Lawyer, but the drive ended on a turnover on downs.

J-Town had one final opportunity, but the Centurion defense closed the game in style. Demario Hatchett, Chapman Amlung and Satterwhite each made tackles before William Ritchie intercepted a pass and returned it 40 yards, nearly taking it all the way for a pick-six. The interception sealed the 28-12 CAL victory.

The Centurions received contributions throughout the lineup, including three touchdowns from Sheehan, a long scoring run from Johnston, key fourth-down stops, multiple tackles for loss, and interceptions from Miller and Ritchie.
