Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship

The Indiana Commission for Higher Education is accepting applications for the Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship, which provides up to \$40,000 of financial aid to aspiring teachers. To qualify, students must rank in the top 20% of their high school class or have a top 20th percentile score on ACT or SAT or have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Ivy Tech Presidential Honors College Scholarship

FSA ID

The FSA ID — a username and password — has replaced the Federal Student Aid PIN and must be used to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education websites. Your FSA ID confirms your identity when you access your financial aid information and electronically sign Federal Student Aid documents. If you do not already have an FSA ID, you can create one. Please visit <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch> to create an ID. FAFSA will opened **December 1, 2023**.

There are major changes and improvements coming to the 2024–25 *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA®) form.

The launch date will apply only for the 2024–25 FAFSA form.

The changes to the FAFSA form for the 2024–25 aid year include

- expanded eligibility for federal student aid and
- a more streamlined application process.

During the 2023 legislative session, the Indiana General Assembly passed [Senate Enrolled Act \(SEA\) 167-2023](#) which requires high school seniors to file the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA) or affirmatively opt out of filing by April 15. Completing the FAFSA is an important step in a postsecondary education. Students pursuing short-term certificate training, associate/bachelor's degrees and even some apprenticeships may receive financial aid by completing the FAFSA.

Students/Parents who do not wish to file the FAFSA may opt out by submitting a FAFSA Waiver Form certifying the student understands what the FAFSA is and declines to complete it. The waiver may be found at <https://www.in.gov/che/state-financial-aid/state-financial-aid-by-program/>. and can be submitted to Mr. Wilson by April 15.



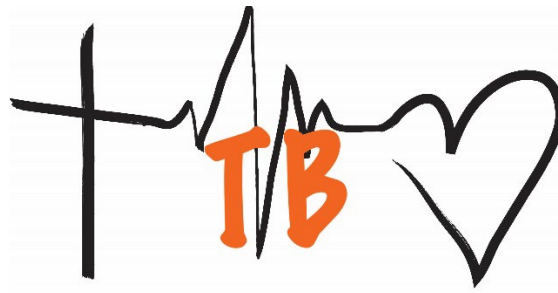
