

#### A Note from the Counselors:

Hi CAL families!

Here are some frequently asked questions about the school counseling role and how we serve students and families.

Q. What is a school counselor?

A. School counselors are defined as: "highly educated, professionally certified individuals who help students succeed in school, plan their career, and form healthy goals, mindsets, and behaviors."

Q. Who do school counselors help?

A. We help ALL students manage emotions and apply interpersonal skills and academic achievement strategies.

Q. Do school counselors provide discipline, therapy, or psychological/ academic testing?

A. No, but we can provide referrals for these resources.

Q. How do school counselors serve students?

A. School counselors:

- · Provide individual student counseling "during times of transition, heightened stress, critical change, or other situations impeding student success"
- Facilitate conflict resolution discussions
- Create and conduct social/emotional lessons
- Provide referrals for long-term support
- Collaborate and share strategies and resources with families/teachers/ administrators/community for student success
- · Advocate for students at student-focused meetings
- Analyze data to identify student issues, needs, and challenges
