DISCUSSION STARTERS

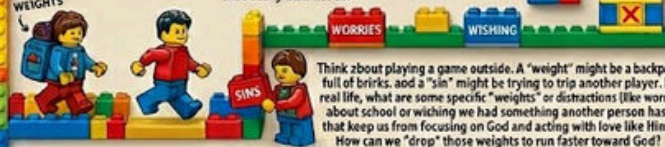
1. The "Like Parent, Like Child" Question



Imagine your family having a "talent show." What is one thing your parent does that you find yourself trying to copy? Maybe they tell great jokes, or they have a specific way of folding laundry. Share a silly or serious way you try to be like them. Why do you think we naturally copy the people we love?

2. The Distraction Obstacle Course Question

The Bible tells us in Hebrews 12:1 to "put aside all the weights and sins that easily distract us."



Think about playing a game outside. A "weight" might be a backpack full of bricks, and a "sin" might be trying to trip another player. In real life, what are some specific "weights" or distractions (like worries about school or wishing we had something another person has) that keep us from focusing on God and acting with love like Him? How can we "drop" those weights to run faster toward God?

GOSPEL REMINDER

Dropping the Weights and Imitating Love

"Do as God does. After all, you are His dear children. Let love be your guide. Christ loved us and offered His life for us as a sacrifice that pleases God." (Ephesians 5:1-2)

"His Children - Copy His Love"

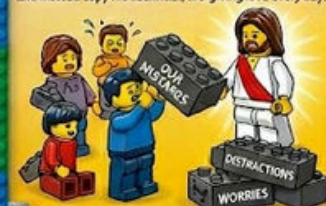


When we follow God, it's not about a list of rules.
