Chapel Table Talk: Like Play-Doh in God's Hands

Scripture Focus: **Philippians 2:14**: "Do everything without grumbling or arguing or complaining."

Guided Questions for Kids

• **Grumble Guard:** Think about times you've cleaned your room, brushed your teeth, or turned off a game. What is hardest to do without complaining?

• **The "Can" Comparison:** If you leave Play-Doh out, it gets hard. If you put it back, it stays soft! How is complaining like crusty dough? How can staying focused on Jesus keep your heart soft?

• **Molding Your Actions:** Play-Doh can be shaped into anything! God wants us to lead in loving and serving. To do that, we must be "changeable". How can you be "moldable" today? Will you be Play-Doh in God's hands?

Gospel Reminder for Parents

Parents, our goal is to introduce our children to the Savior who transforms hearts. Often, we are just as prone to "grumbling, arguing, or complaining" as they are!

The good news of the Gospel is that **God isn't done molding us or them.** We don't have to be perfect; we just have to be soft. Our best teaching is swift repentance and reliance on God's strength—what moldable looks like in His hands. Let His patience shape us first to lead with a soft heart.

Family Challenge

Find some Play-Doh! If it's soft, talk about how easy it is to shape. If it's crusty, talk about asking God to "soften" our hearts when we feel a grumble coming on!

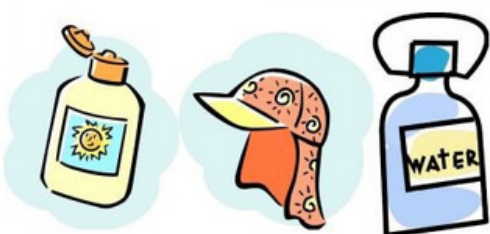
Hello CAL Families,
