Come work alongside our Elementary Library staff at the Spring Book Fair. Or help the Providence School for World Down Syndrome Day, March 21.

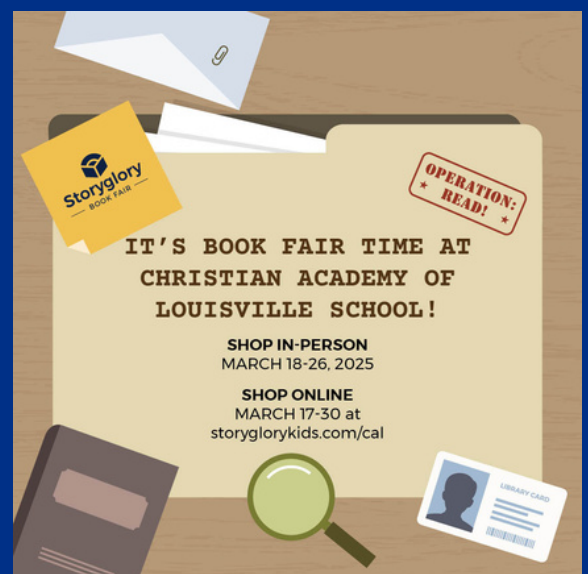

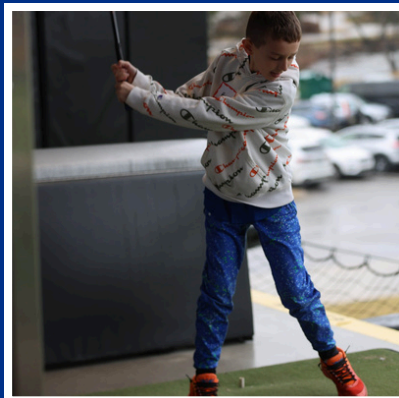

# ALL School Happenings... Unity Week

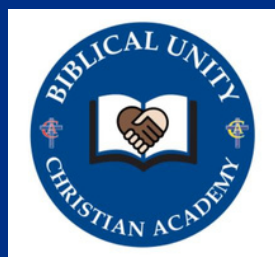

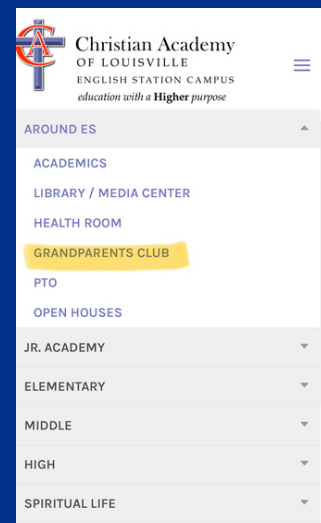
