





For Valedictorian and Salutatorian, we calculate the GPA using a formula incorporating quality points*

*Quality points are determined by the most number of classes, highest level of classes, and the best grades in those classes. Study halls and other non-credit awarding classes will affect the formula used in the computation.

Most high schools do not rank

ACT/SAT

- Take with **entire** junior class at CAL April 8th
- Register NOW for a test, online (There are only 3 ACTs left before your senior year -- April 5th, June 14th, and July 12th)
- Take the test *again* your senior year depending on situation and reason
- May want to take a prep class after your first test (i.e. try using Method Learning and <u>myact.org</u>)
- Include your SSN when you register for the test
- Register for the SAT online at collegeboard.org (Test dates before and during senior year – March 8th, May 3rd, June 7th, August 23rd, October 4th and November 8th)

ACT/SAT

- The format for the ACT is changing.
- **IF** the school where you take it offers it online, there will be only 3 sections—English, Math, and Reading with a testing time of 125 minutes.
- In the fall, **ALL** tests, both paper and online, will only have the 3 sections. The testing time will be reduced for the all regular testing to 125 minutes.
- There will be fewer questions in each section with a total of 44 fewer questions for the test.
- The Science section is a separate test just like the Writing section. You will need to see if your college choice requires it.


Spring break is a great time!!!

Math Options


- If Current Class is **CP Algebra II** and are college bound → CP Precalculus
- If Current Class is **CP Algebra I** I and are NOT college bound

 → CP Consumer Math
- If Current Class is **H Algebra II** \Longrightarrow CP/H Precalculus
- If Current Class is **CP Precalculus** CP Statistics, H Calculus, or AP Statistics
- If Current Class is **H Precalculus** CP Statistics, H Calculus, AP Calculus, or AP Statistics

Strongly Suggest

- Academic Subjects
- Science for 4 years
- Colleges look closely at senior schedule (especially selective schools)
- Colleges know you usually only have a few classes left . . . they want to see that you aren't "taking a break" your senior year and choosing the "easiest" courses
- It helps to "stay in the groove"

Advanced Placement

- College level course
- Must have recommendation requirements
- Must pass exam in order to have college credit
- Great preparation for college
- \$100 fee charged for the exam

Dual Enrollment (DE)

- Be aware of minimum GPA
- May be able to use KEES Scholarship
- ACT A minimum composite score with a certain sub-score in the subject area that corresponds with the high school dual credit course may be required, or

Academic Excellence & Spiritual Vitality

PSAT – composite score may be required in a certain percentile


