

The College Prep Program is more intense and includes course work required by major colleges and universities. The Honors Program provides a challenging course of study for top students and includes courses that offer the opportunity to earn college credit while at CAL Students are not restricted to taking courses in one program. How to Register

Current students will register for their classes online through RenWeb.

Current 8th grade students and high school students must register online in March, watch for an email.

 Please be sure you have a working log-on and password before these dates. If you do not have a log-on and password, please contact the high school office. During the

- registration dates, you may go online and make changes to your requests. After these dates, changes can only be made by contacting the high school office.
- New students to CAL must register using a Course Request Form. These forms will be mailed to all newly accepted students (or can be picked up from the high school office) and should be returned to the high school office as soon as possible upon acceptance.

Adding/Dropping

A student may add and drop classes provided there is an opening in the class the student wishes to enter. Requests for schedule changes should be directed to the counselor. Note the potential penalty involved in dropping classes:

- ✓ 1st week of the 1st Semester—May add or drop with no penalty. Any fees paid will be refunded.
- √ 2nd—6th week of 1st Semester— Students may be withdrawn passing (WP) or withdrawn failing (WP). Students may or may not be allowed to add a course at this time. This does not affect student's GPA. If a fee was paid for the class, no fee will be refunded.
- √ After the Sth week of the semester students may be withdrawn with special permission from the principal. If a fee was paid for the class, no fee will be refunded.



*Quality points are determined by the most number of classes, highest level of classes, and the best grades in those classes. Study halls and other non-credit awarding classes will affect the formula used in the computation.

KEES Scholarship

KEES – Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship

- Each year of high school you can earn scholarship money towards in-state college tuition
- The High School office **must** have your Social Security Number to register for the scholarship.
- The **unweighted** GPA is submitted (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0).






Method Learning

- Some classes incorporate program into curriculum
- 2 full practice tests, lessons, quizzes, vocabulary
- You can monitor your progress
- 20 weeks of activities and lessons
- Quizzes provide the reasoning behind correct/wrong answers



4CT

Service Hours



- Must have 60 to graduate
- 30 **must** be outside of the Christian community
- Not for a relative
- Can start summer after 8th grade
- Mission trips, up to 8 hours per day

Keep List for Resume

- Keep a folder, notebook, drawer, etc. for holding information on awards, honors, jobs, activities, mission trips, community service, . . .
- Puts information right at your fingertips when filling out college and scholarship applications
- Makes it easy to develop a resume you can provide as a courtesy to those people writing letters of recommendation

- Make sure you keep a reasonable bedtime – sleep is important!
