AP Human Geography – Summer Homework

Welcome to AP Human Geography! This course explores how people interact with the world around them. This assignment will help you jump right into the course and build a strong understanding of the world's geography from the start. Your summer assignment will focus on learning the world's political geography (countries, borders, and regions).

Part 1: Label & Color Political Maps

Your first task is to **label and color political maps** for different parts of the world. This will help you get familiar with where countries and states are located.

What to do:

Part 1:

- 1. Print the following maps:
 - o Political map of the United States
 - o Political map of North America and Central America
 - o Political map of South America
 - o Political map of Europe
 - o Political map of Africa
 - o Political map of Asia and the Middle East (This can be separate maps)

2. Label each map:

- o For the U.S. map, write in the name of each state.
- o For the **continent maps**, label the name of **each country** by hand.

3. Color the countries by region:

- o Choose different colors to show how **you group countries into regions**.
- o Example: You might color all of **Western Europe** blue, and **Eastern Europe** green.
- There's no one right answer it's based on your own reasoning!

4. Create a key/legend:

- o In the corner of each map, make a **color key** that explains your regions.
- o Example: "Green = West Africa," "Blue = East Africa"
- o **Also write a sentence** explaining how *you* decided what counts as a region. (This helps your teacher understand how you think geographically.)
