Students will gain fundamental knowledge of security principles and practices, develop risk-based solutions to problems and understand threats and vulnerabilities. By graduation, students will be able to apply problem-solving and critical thinking skills to issues like terrorism, criminal investigations and emergency management.

Students in the GSIS program can choose from three tracks to specialize their degree:

- Intelligence Studies
- Chinese Language and Asian Studies
- Security Operations Management

Throughout their coursework, students will utilize the Global Security Operations Center (GSOC) to conduct practical emergency response drills using a software simulation program developed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

FSA ID

The FSA ID — a username and password — has replaced the Federal Student Aid PIN and must be used to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education websites. Your FSA ID confirms your identity when you access your financial aid information and electronically sign Federal Student Aid documents. If you do not already have an FSA ID, you can create one. Please visit <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch> to create an ID. FAFSA opened **December 1, 2023**.

How to file the 2024-2025 FAFSA

Students can file the FAFSA online at studentaid.gov. Information needed to complete the FAFSA include:

- FSA ID
- Federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned from 2022
- List of any federal benefits received
- Asset information including bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)

Help is available

Outreach Coordinators are strategically located in eight geographic regions in Indiana and can help students, families, and educators with questions about state financial aid and filing the FAFSA.

If the recipient, thereafter, decides not to attend the designated school or university, the recipient will have the responsibility of transferring the money to another school or university. If no other school or university is designated, the money will be returned to the FCBA and retained by the FCBA for future scholarships. In no event shall the FCBA pay the scholarship directly to the recipient, unless a written request is made and the FCBA deems that special circumstances warrant. 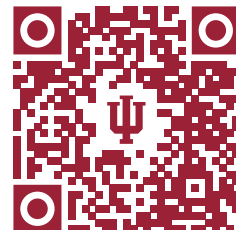
