Daily Information

Morning Arrival

- All elementary students will be dropped off at the front entrance (door 1).
- Elementary carline will begin at 7:40 a.m.
- The tardy bell will be at 8 a.m. Students should be in their classroom before 8 a.m.
- Parents will be allowed to enter the building only if they have a meeting.
- Elementary students arriving before 7:35 a.m. will be sent to the cafeteria for Before-school Care until dismissed at 7:35 a.m.*

Afternoon Dismissal

- Driveline dismissal will begin at 2:35 p.m.
- New Car Tags will be distributed at K-Day/Meet the Teacher Day, August 5/6.
- Parents will not be allowed to walk up to dismissal locations or come inside to pick up their students until after Driveline is over at 3 p.m.
- Students not picked up in the carline will go to the cafeteria for After-school Care.*
- All **kindergarten** students will be dismissed at 12 p.m. on the first week of school, August 7-9. After-school care* will not be available for kindergarten during the first week of school.

(Carline maps will be available prior to the start of school with more specifics. Please plan for heavy traffic and expect delays. The systems work and will improve.)

Visitors/Volunteers

- All visitors must enter through door 1 at the elementary main entrance and check-in at the front desk. The first check-in of the school year requires a driver's license or similar valid ID.
- No visitors will be allowed past the front desks during the school day unless permitted by a previously scheduled appointment.
- Cafeteria Volunteers- We can have up to three volunteers per day in the cafeteria from 10:30 a.m.- 12 p.m. This is a great time to see your child and classmates socialize and help students open lunch items, clean spills or serve condiments. Building Safety and Security



- Christian Academy School System has a task force team that monitors the security of BOTH campuses. All of our employees go through quality training for emergency response and other crisis intervention practices. We view the safety of our students and employees as everyone's responsibility so that all employees are empowered to respond in an emergency situation.
- The exterior doors of the building are locked at all times, and visitors are only admitted at the elementary and high school/middle school entrance.
- All visitors are verified and checked in with our Visitor Management school security system.
