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Admissions Policy

Subject to the faith-based standards and beliefs stated in the Christian Academy policies and procedures, Christian Academy School System admits students of any race, gender, color, nationality or ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, gender, color, nationality or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, tuition grant program, athletic and other school-administered programs.

Christian Academy was established on the biblical principle that God gives parents the primary responsibility for educating their children. The school enters into a partnership with parents and Christian educators to teach academics in the context of a Christian worldview. Christian Academy's policy is to offer enrollment to students of Christian parents who desire a Bible-based education with academic excellence for their children. Junior Academy Program Philosophy of Teaching and Learning

Junior Academy joins with the Christian family to provide for each child's individual needs entrusted to our care. We strive to focus on each child's individual needs in the light of God's Word. We desire for each child to learn about Jesus and how HE wants us to live. Junior Academy is a biblically immersed preschool program defined by developmentally appropriate academic learning and purposeful play. Academic learning is supported by the biblically-integrated curriculum, resources, and centers to develop students socially, emotionally, and spiritually. The curriculum is based on the understanding that young children's play is their "work." Junior Academy trains children to develop through a balance of child-initiated and teacher-directed activities to help prepare the children for future academic growth and development.



Our Junior Academy is open to children the ages of 3 - 4 (potty training is required for enrollment). Children must meet the age requirements on or prior to August 1.

Full Day Program

The full-day Junior Academy (Preschool) program is available for students, Monday-Friday, from 7 a.m. - 4 p.m. A separate Junior Academy After-school Care program will be offered from 4 p.m. - 6 p.m. at an additional cost for families who choose to register.

Christian Academy of Indiana - Junior Academy 2024-2025 Schedule of Tuition and Fees

The mission of Christian Academy School System is to develop students with a heart for God who grow as Jesus did in wisdom, stature and favor with God and men.

NEW STUDENTS:

Application Fee – A fee of \$100 per Junior Academy student must accompany each application. The application fee is non-refundable.

RETURNING STUDENTS:

Continuous Enrollment Fee – A non-refundable fee of \$100 per Junior Academy student is due **February 28, 2024**. This fee will be paid in conjunction with the online continuous enrollment process through FACTS. (FACTS refers to this as "Downpayment")

TUITION/FEE POLICY

Tuition and other fees are necessary in order for Christian Academy to fulfill its mission of developing students with a heart for God. In support of this, parents are expected to commit themselves to meet financial obligations promptly in accordance with Biblical stewardship and to comply with the following policy:

The Continuous Enrollment Fee is non-refundable unless for any reason Christian Academy does not readmit the student. If parents withdraw their student's enrollment for any reason, the Continuous Enrollment Fee is non-refundable. (FACTS refers to this as "Downpayment")

The school has contracted with FACTS Tuition Management for the processing of all tuition payments. The following payment options are available through FACTS:

- Annual Payment due June 14, 2024.
- Monthly Payments (August through May). A \$50 annual processing fee per family is required for using this
 service and will be automatically drafted from your account by FACTS within 14 days of the agreement being
 posted to the FACTS system.

A one-month notice must be given for any withdrawals prior to the end of the school year because the hiring of teachers and staff and the ordering of classroom materials are based upon anticipated enrollment. Notice must be provided by completing the Withdrawal Form located in your Web Forms in FACTS Family Portal.

Tuition that becomes two months past due will subject the student to being withheld from attending school.

Because tuition is calculated on an annual basis, no adjustments will be made for absences, holidays or unscheduled closures.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Tuition assistance awards are based on the family's demonstrated need as determined by a third-party agency that makes financial needs assessments for private and Christian schools. Each award is made for one year only, based on the availability of tuition assistance funds.

ADDITIONAL FEES

- Missed Payment Fee Missed payment fees are assessed by FACTS if payment is not received as scheduled.
- After-hour Fee An after-hour fee of \$2.00 per minute per student will be charged beginning at 12 PM (half-day program), 4 PM (full-day program), and 6 PM (After-School Care Program).
- Returned Check Fee A \$25 returned check fee will be charged on all returned checks.
- Miscellaneous Expenses During the course of the school year, other expenses may be incurred for
 various services or activities. Notice of at least two weeks will be given before such a fee is due, and
 participation in the activity is typically optional.

AFTER-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAM

- Families may opt to register to attend the After-School Care program from 4 PM to 6 PM.
- Registration opens in Spring 2024.
- Cost is \$1300 per school year per student (\$650/semester), scheduled through FACTS.
- An after-hour fee of \$2.00 per minute per student will be charged beginning at 6 PM.
- Withdrawals from the After-School Care program must be made at the change in semester. Notice should be provided in writing to the Business Office at least one month in advance.

SUMMER SESSION (Full-day Program, 7 AM – 4 PM only)

- Families may opt to register to attend the Summer Session during June and July. Registration for this program will occur each spring.
- An activity fee will be assessed for each Summer Session.

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Christian Academy is committed to making Christian Education as affordable as possible. Over 80% of our K-12 CAI families receive tuition support through financial assistance and discount programs totaling over \$5.6 million in support*.

How Do I Apply for Need-Based Assistance or the Indiana Choice Scholarship?

Go to online factsmut.com to create an account and submit a Tuition Assistance Application to Christian Academy of Indiana for your student.

What Sources of Assistance are Available?

Families can apply for the Indiana Choice Scholarship, SGO Scholarship, and our own tuition assistance.

What is the Indiana Choice Scholarship?

The Indiana Choice Scholarship, also known as the voucher program, allows for state funding to be used towards private tuition for qualifying students.

To Qualify for the Choice Scholarship, Students Must Be:

- A resident of Indiana
- In Grades K-12
- Within Income Guidelines (See eligibility chart on next page.)

What is an SGO Scholarship?

An SGO (Scholarship Granting Organization) Scholarship is provided by the generosity of donors for students in grades JA-12 to attend CAI. CAI awards the SGO scholarships to families based on qualifying need as determined by FACTS Grant and Aid.

How Do I Know If I Qualify?

Apply for the Choice Scholarship, tuition assistance, and SGO by submitting an application online through FACTS Grant and Aid at online factsmgt.com.

CHRISTIAN ACADEMY SCHOOL SYSTEM CAI Junior Academy After-School Care Program 2023-2024 POLICY

Advance registration through FACTS Family Portal is required to participate in the Junior Academy After-School Care Program (ASC). After-School Care fees will be collected through your FACTS agreement through automatic withdrawal along with scheduled tuition payments.

PROGRAM INFORMATION:

- JA ASC begins at 4:00 PM and ends at 6:00 PM. A late pick-up fee of \$2.00/minute/student is assessed and will be invoiced and paid through FACTS Tuition Management.
- As always, Junior Academy staff members will serve your children during the After-School Care hours.
 All staff members will continue to meet state requirements as well as Christian Academy School System standards to work with your children.

PROGRAM RATES:

\$1200 annually (\$600/semester) through FACTS Tuition Management. Payments will be automatically withdrawn on the same date and same account as your scheduled tuition payments.

PROGRAM POLICIES:

- Registration of new students and withdrawals of participation may only change at the beginning of the second semester with a one-month written notice to the Business Office. Opting in and out during the course of a semester is not permitted.
- No care will be provided for holidays, early dismissals, or unscheduled closures. Rates are calculated
 on a semester basis; therefore, no adjustments will be made for missed days, holidays, early
 dismissals, or unscheduled closures.
- After-School Care enrollment may be suspended for any student whose account becomes two months past due.
