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Admissions Policy


Special Areas

High School Program Overview

Graduation Requirements

The Core 40 Program includes coursework required by major colleges and universities. The Core 40 with Academic Honors Program provides a challenging course of study for top students and includes courses that offer the opportunity to earn college credit while at Christian Academy of Indiana. Sixty hours of community service are required for graduation

> Bible (8 credits) Language Arts (8 credits) Science (6 credits) Mathematics (6 credits)

Basic credit requirements for both diplomas: Social Studies (6 credits) Health & Safety (1 credit) Physical Education (2 credits) Electives (6 credits)

Additionally, five credits of directed electives (Foreign Language, Fine Arts or Career/Technical) are required for the Core 40 Program.

The Core 40 with Academic Honors Program requires 6-8 Foreign Language credits, two additional math credits and two credits of Fine Arts. Students earning the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma must earn a "C" or above in courses that will count toward the diploma and a grade point average of 3.0 or above and meet additional requirements through AP courses, dual credit or SAT/ACT scores for a total of 47 required credits.

Dual-Credit Program

Students may take courses from an Indiana college or university for high school credit. GPA for post-secondary/AP credit is on a 5.0 scale. Eight courses offered in the CAI curriculum are eligible college credit through Ivy Tech Community College.

Honors Courses and Advanced Placement Courses

English I, II, III & IV, Biology II, Spanish III & IV, World History, Algebra I & II, Geometry, Economics, Choral Chamber Singers and Advanced Concert Band are offered as honors courses. Advanced Placement courses are 2D and 3D Art, Chemistry, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Computer Science, Drawing and Painting, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, U.S. Government and Politics, and U.S. History.

Program Highlights

Christian Academy students have the opportunity to participate in daily Bible instruction, weekly Chapel times, domestic and international mission trips and community service projects. Students also have the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities including Choir, Band, Yearbook, Drama, Archery, Student Council, Spanish Club, National Honor Society, International Mission Trips, Spanish National Honor Society, retreats and other clubs and class activities.

Technology

Over the years, we have embraced digital projectors, 3D printers and laptop computers which have greatly enhanced the learning experience for students and teachers alike. All students grade 9-12 receive a Chromebook and students grade Kindergarten-8 have access to Chromebooks in the classroom.

College Attendance

In the class of 2023, 71% pursued a post-secondary education. 96% of those attended a four-year college and 4% attended a two-year college. 19% chose to attend a Christian college.

Academic Distinction

The Class of 2023 had 3 students recognized as AP Scholars (passing 3 exams), 2 students as AP Scholars with Honors (passing 4 exams) and 3 students as AP Scholars with Distinction (passing 5 or more exams).

Student Scholarships

The total scholarship award amount for the Class of 2023 was \$2,364,984.

Service

Our students are involved in service and mission projects to the community, the nation and the world. Last year, our graduating class completed over 3,000 hours of community service over the course of their high school career.

NEW STUDENTS:

Application Fee – A non-refundable fee of \$100 per student must accompany each application. Continuous Enrollment Fee - When your student is accepted to Christian Academy, a non-refundable Continuous Enrollment Fee of \$300 will be collected to enroll your student.

RETURNING STUDENTS:

Continuous Enrollment Fee – A non-refundable fee of \$300 per student is due February 10, 2023. This fee will be paid in conjunction with the online continuous enrollment process through FACTS.

TUITION/FEE POLICY

Tuition and other fees are necessary in order for Christian Academy to fulfill its mission of developing students with a heart for God. In support of this, parents are expected to commit themselves to meet financial obligations promptly in accordance with Biblical stewardship and comply with the following policy:

The Continuous Enrollment Fee is non-refundable unless for any reason Christian Academy does not readmit the student. If parents withdraw their student's enrollment for any reason, the fee is non-refundable.

The school has contracted with FACTS Tuition Management Company for the processing of all tuition payments. The following payment options are available through FACTS:

- Annual Payment due June 15, 2023.
- Monthly Payments (June through May). A \$50 annual processing fee per family is required for using this service and will be automatically drafted from your account by FACTS within 14 days of the agreement being posted to the FACTS system.

Because the hiring of teachers and staff and the ordering of textbooks and other classroom materials are based upon enrollment, withdrawals are subject to the following obligation:

- Withdrawals after June 1 •
- one-month's tuition is due
- Withdrawals after July 1 •
 - Withdrawals after August 1

- Withdrawals after the start of school
- two-months' tuition is due
- three months' tuition is due
- full year's tuition is due

Parents are expected to pay tuition and fees in a timely manner, according to the current Schedule of Tuition and Fees. Student records will not be released and no credit for a student's work can be earned unless all financial obligations are met. Tuition that becomes two months past due will subject the student to being withheld from attending school until such amounts due to Christian Academy School System are made current.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Tuition assistance awards are based on the family's demonstrated need as determined by a third-party agency that makes financial needs assessments for private and Christian schools. Each award is made for one year only, based on the availability of tuition assistance funds.

ADDITIONAL FEES

•	High School/Middle School Athletic Fee	Athletic participation fees for the 2022-2023 school year were \$225 for high school for each sport in which the student participated with an annual per student maximum of \$450 and \$175 for middle school for each sport in which the student participated with an annual per student maximum of \$350 . Athletic participation fees for the 2023-2024 school year will be determined in the spring. There may be additional uniform and team fees that vary from sport to sport.
•	Food Service	The cost of daily lunch for the 2022-2023 school year was \$3.75 for elementary and \$4.25 for middle and high school students. À la carte food items for middle and high school students vary in cost. However, increases in the wholesale cost of food and supplies to our kitchen periodically necessitate a corresponding increase in the price of the lunch. Parents are encouraged to deposit money into their student's debit account in the cafeteria to expedite the speed of the serving line.
•	Miscellaneous Expenses	During the course of the school year other expenses are incurred for various services or activities such as Advanced Placement classes, school picture packages, class functions, intramural sports, music programs and plays. Most of these expenses are optional. The school makes every effort to keep these expenses to a minimum.
•	International Students	Additional fees apply. Contact lbaechtel@caschools.us for information.
•	Missed Payment Fee	Missed payment fees are assessed by FACTS if payment is not received as scheduled.
•	Returned Check Fee	Christian Academy will charge a \$25 returned check fee for all returned checks.

Please Note: For students participating in high school sports, the Indiana High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) requires that tuition expenses not covered by allowable merit aid or need-based financial aid must be paid by immediate family/legal guardians. Please refer to IHSAA Rules for definition and guidelines.

- In Grades K-12
- Within Income Guidelines (See eligibility chart on next page.)

What is an SGO Scholarship?

An SGO (Scholarship Granting Organization) Scholarship is provided by the generosity of donors for students in grades JA-12 to attend CAI. CAI awards the SGO scholarships to families based on qualifying need as determined by FACTS Grant and Aid.

How Do I Know If I Qualify?

Apply for the Choice Scholarship, tuition assistance, and SGO by submitting an application online through FACTS Grant and Aid at online factsing com.
