Curriculum

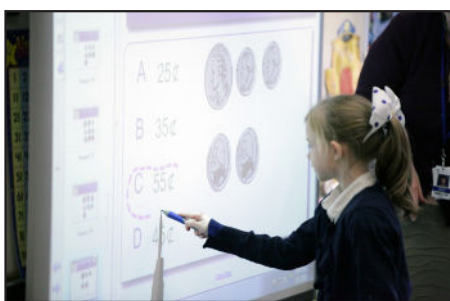

Language arts is centered on a strong foundation in phonics, and explicit instruction in comprehension and writing. Mathematics and STEM instruction is focused on developing conceptual understanding, procedural knowledge, and problem solving ability.

Special Areas

All students participate in seven special areas each week consisting of Art, Music, Library, Technology, 5th Grade Band, Choir and Physical Education.

Core Courses

Middle School students have the opportunity to engage in classes in Bible, Literature, English, Math, History, Geography and Science.

Elective Courses

Sports

High School Program Overview

Graduation Requirements

The Core 40 Program includes coursework required by major colleges and universities. The Core 40 with Academic Honors Program provides a challenging course of study for top students and includes courses that offer the opportunity to earn college credit while at Christian Academy of Indiana. Sixty hours of community service are required for graduation

Basic credit requirements for both diplomas:

Bible (8 credits)

Language Arts (8 credits)

Science (6 credits)

Mathematics (6 credits)

Social Studies (6 credits)

Health & Safety (1 credit)

Physical Education (2 credits)

Electives (6 credits)

Additionally, five credits of directed electives (Foreign Language, Fine Arts or Career/Technical) are required for the Core 40 Program.

The Core 40 with Academic Honors Program requires 6-8 Foreign Language credits, two additional math credits and two credits of Fine Arts. Students earning the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma must earn a "C" or above in courses that will count toward the diploma and a grade point average of 3.0 or above and meet additional requirements through AP courses, dual credit or SAT/ACT scores for a total of 47 required credits.

Dual-Credit Program

Students may take courses from an Indiana college or university for high school credit. GPA for post-secondary/AP credit is on a 5.0 scale. Eight courses offered in the CAI curriculum are eligible college credit through Ivy Tech Community College.

Honors Courses and Advanced Placement Courses

English I, II, III & IV, Biology II, Spanish III & IV, World History, Algebra I & II, Geometry, Economics, Choral Chamber Singers and Advanced Concert Band are offered as honors courses. Advanced Placement courses are 2D and 3D Art, Chemistry, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Computer Science, Drawing and Painting, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, U.S. Government and Politics, and U.S. History.

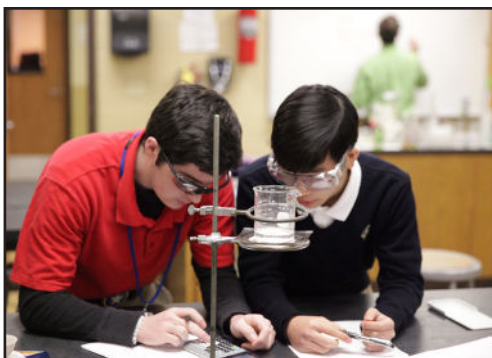
Program Highlights

Christian Academy students have the opportunity to participate in daily Bible instruction, weekly Chapel times, domestic and international mission trips and community service projects. Students also have the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities including Choir, Band, Yearbook, Drama, Archery, Student Council, Spanish Club, National Honor Society, International Mission Trips, Spanish National Honor Society, retreats and other clubs and class activities.

Technology

Over the years, we have embraced digital projectors, 3D printers and laptop computers which have greatly enhanced the learning experience for students and teachers alike. All students grade 9-12 receive a Chromebook and students grade Kindergarten-8 have access to Chromebooks in the classroom.

Excellence in Education

ACT

97% of the Class of 2023 took the ACT, scoring a composite of 21.1. This score was above the national average composite score of 20.3.

College Attendance

In the class of 2023, 71% pursued a post-secondary education. 96% of those attended a four-year college and 4% attended a two-year college. 19% chose to attend a Christian college.

Academic Distinction

The Class of 2023 had 3 students recognized as AP Scholars (passing 3 exams), 2 students as AP Scholars with Honors (passing 4 exams) and 3 students as AP Scholars with Distinction (passing 5 or more exams).

Student Scholarships

The total scholarship award amount for the Class of 2023 was \$2,364,984.

Service

Our students are involved in service and mission projects to the community, the nation and the world. Last year, our graduating class completed over 3,000 hours of community service over the course of their high school career.

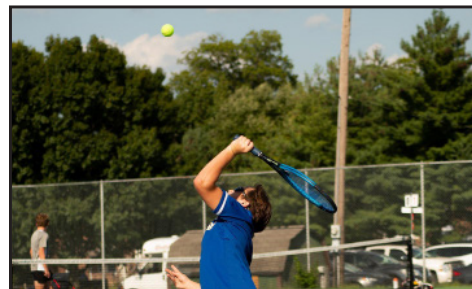
Warrior Athletics
