

CAI Middle School courses are intentionally designed to provide rich opportunities for students to discover their talents and thrive emotionally, spiritually, and academically before they transition into more rigorous options in high school.

All courses align with Indiana Academic Standards and are supported by the Christian Academy School System Biblical Worldview Standards.

Courses are based on daily 50-minute classes, with the exception of English, which consists of two 50-min classes each day.

Exploratory Class Schedules:
Students will select two exploratory classes that will rotate weekly throughout the year. 7th graders will also have an exploratory block when they will choose 4 courses to rotate through quarterly. 8th graders will take Computer Science and Preparation for College and Careers, rotating each semester, for high school graduation credit.

Students in grades 6-8 will select Band, Choir, or Art (7th & 8th grade), as their primary elective and will have this class three days per week for the entire year. **Athletics:** Basketball, Baseball, Volleyball, Archery, Cheerleading, Cross Country, Soccer, Tennis, Softball, Track & Field
