FSAID

The FSA ID — a username and password — has replaced the Federal Student Aid PIN and must be used to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education websites. Your FSA ID confirms your identity when you access your financial aid information and electronically sign Federal Student Aid documents. If you do not already have an FSA ID, you can create one. Please visit https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch to create an ID. FAFSA will open December 1, 2023.

During the 2023 legislative session, the Indiana General Assembly passed <u>Senate Enrolled Act (SEA) 167-2023</u> which requires high school seniors to file the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA) or affirmatively opt out of filing by April 15. Completing the FAFSA is an important step in a postsecondary education. Students pursuing short-term certificate training, associate/bachelor's degrees and even some apprenticeships may receive financial aid by completing the FAFSA.

Students/Parents who do not wish to file the FAFSA may opt out by submitting a FAFSA Waiver Form certifying the student understands what the FAFSA is and declines to complete it. The waiver may be found at https://www.in.gov/che/state-financial-aid/state-financial-aid-by-program/. and can be submitted to Mr. Wilson by April 15.

College admissions testing

College entrance exams provide feedback on academic strengths and college preparedness to Colleges and Universities around the country. Results of one or both tests may be required for admission to most institutions of higher learning. Students are encouraged to take entrance exams at least twice. Where will I be staying?

Students will be assigned to dormitories in one of Hanover College's air-conditioned residence halls. Meals will be served in the Campus Center's main dining hall or provided for field trips.

How much does the program cost?

The cost for each institute is \$800; this includes the cost of housing, meals and necessary supplies. Students who enroll at Hanover will have the cost of the program deducted from their first year of tuition.
